



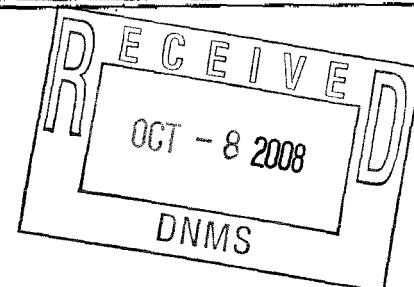

Dear Mr. Torres:

We have received the recently published Licensing Guidance for the Intraocular Use of Neovista, Inc.'s Epi-Rad (Strontium-90) Ophthalmic System. We commit to implementing this guidance.

In addition, we request that you incorporate a change process into our license, which would allow us to make future changes to the radiation safety program without requesting a license amendment. Such changes would be allowed if the following conditions were met:

- the revision is in compliance with the regulations; and
- the revision is based on NRC's current licensing guidance for the NeoVista Epi-Rad System, pursuant to 10 CFR 35.1000 use, as posted on the NRC web site; and
- the revision has been reviewed and approved by the radiation safety officer and management; and
- the affected individuals are instructed on the revised program before the change is implemented; and
- the record of each change is retained for five years; and
- the record will include a copy of the appropriate Web site guidance, the old procedure, the new procedure, the effective date of the change, and the signature of the management representative that reviewed and approved the change.
