I am working on your license amendment. As part of recent policy changes for security, we can no longer list the ni-63 sources in the amount of "no single sources to exceed the maximum activity specified in the certificate of registration...".

Instead, we have gone back to listing "not to exceed XX millicuries per source and YY millicuries total". We are making this change whenever an amendment request or renewal comes in.

Please let me know what quantities you want listed for this item. Everything else is okay for me to proceed with the amendment.
