SEQUOYAH NUCLEAR PLANT (SQN) UNITS 1 AND 2; WATTS BAR NUCLEAR PLANT (WBN) UNITS 1 AND 2 - REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REGARDING MAIN STEAM LINE BREAKS IN ICE CONDENSER PLANTS

Reference: Gary G. Zech's letter to S. A. White dated April 8, 1988, "Request for Additional Information Regarding Main Steam Line Breaks in Ice Condenser Plants"

Westinghouse Electric Corporation Topical Report WCAP-10988, "COBRA-NC, Analysis for a Main Steamline Break in the Catawba Unit 1 Ice Condenser Containment," was submitted to NRC to support the staff's review of the modifications made by Westinghouse to the LOTIC-III computer code. The LOTIC-III modifications are described in WCAP-10986P, "Ice Condenser Drain Test Results, Data Analysis, and Development of Drain Flow Models for LOTIC-III Ice Condenser Code." WCAP-10988 and WCAP-10986P were submitted by Westinghouse to the NRC on November 27, 1985.

To aid in NRC's review of WCAP-10986P, the referenced letter requested additional information needed by Argonne National Laboratory (ANL) to perform an independent confirmatory analysis for the NRC of WCAP-10988. The enclosed Westinghouse addendums to WCAP-10988 (proprietary) and WCAP-10989 (nonproprietary) provide the requested information. There are no new commitments made by TVA in this letter.

Also enclosed is Westinghouse's "Application For Withholding Proprietary Information from Public Disclosure," CAW-88-042, which includes an accompanying affidavit and proprietary information notice from Westinghouse. Because this letter contains information proprietary to Westinghouse, it is supported by an affidavit signed by Westinghouse, the owner of the information. The affidavit sets forth the basis on which the information may be withheld from public disclosure by the Commission and addresses with specificity the considerations listed in paragraph (b)(4) of section 2.790 of the Commission's regulations.

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TVA requests that the information that is proprietary to Westinghouse be withheld from public disclosure in accordance with 10 CFR 2.790 of the Commission's regulations.
