Submittal of Engineering Analysis Related to Implementation of Order (EA-07-140)
Imposing Additional Security Measures for the American Centrifuge Plant (TAC L32307)

Dear Mr. Weber:

On July 26, 2007, USEC Inc. (USEC) provided a 20-day response (Reference 1) to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) regarding an Order issued on July 5, 2007, imposing additional security measures for the American Centrifuge Plant (ACP). In a meeting with NRC staff in Rockville, MD on March 25, 2008, USEC presented our preliminary analysis and plans for compliance with the Order.

NRC staff conducted a follow-up conference call with USEC staff on August 12, 2008 requesting confirmation of the certainty in USEC's methodology presented during the March 25, 2008 closed meeting. Enclosure 1 of this letter provides USEC's findings as documented within EE-3908-0001 (Revision 0) entitled "Engineering Analysis to Establish Critical Target Areas for the American Centrifuge Plant and Identify Additional Security Measures (U)." As requested by Reference 2, this analysis documents the evaluation of the Integrated Safety Analysis events that indicated "high" consequences. Attachment A of this Engineering Analysis provides the case summaries for the additional consequence analyses that were performed using the RASCAL consequence modeling software and is being submitted under separate cover (AET 08-0072). As discussed with NRC staff, it is anticipated that a revision to this analysis will be submitted following the finalization of the planned Feed and Withdrawal design changes.

USEC requests that NRC complete their review within 30 days of receipt of this submittal. Upon NRC notification of agreement with the Engineering Analysis, USEC will develop an action plan to meet the imposed additional security measures and submit it to the NRC for review.
