Enclosed is Amendment No. 64 to your NRC Material License No. 21-01549-02 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in bold font.

This amendment authorizes the release for unrestricted use of your temporary hot lab at 703 N. McEwan Street, Clare, Michigan as described in your facsimile dated July 30, 2008. I also incorporated the changes requested in your facsimiles dated September 12, 2008, and September 29, 2008.

Please note that by License Condition 14, you are required to comply with the requirements of the "Order Imposing Increased Controls" (ADAMS Accession No. (ML053130218) published in the Federal Register on December 1, 2005 (70 FR 72128); and with the "Order Imposing Fingerprinting and Criminal History Records Check Requirements for Unescorted Access to Certain Radioactive Materials" (Fingerprinting Order) (ADAMS Accession No. (ML073230831) published in the Federal Register on December 13, 2007 (72 FR 70901).

This License Condition requires that you complete implementation of said requirements by the first day that radionuclides in quantities of concern are possessed at or above the limits specified in "Table 1: Radionuclides of Concern" contained within the fingerprinting Order, and notify, in writing, the Director, Office of Federal and State Materials and Environmental Management Programs, U.S. NRC, Washington, DC, 20555, when you have completed the requirements of this License Condition.

Our records indicate that you are currently implementing the Increased Controls requirements.

Accordingly, in this Amendment I have included your response letters dated December 7, 2005, and February 26, 2008, in the last Condition of your license, Condition No. 15.
