Dear Mr. Crane:

I am responding to your October 13, 2008, letter to the Chairman of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), in which you reiterated the concerns in your April 24 and June 29, 2008, letters with regard to the patients' rights advocate representation on the NRC's Advisory Committee on the Medical Uses of Isotopes (ACMUI).

The NRC staff understands that there are two organizations with different objectives but with near-identical names. We verified that the current patients' rights advocate serving on the ACMUI has only been involved as a volunteer with the organization registered as a 501(c)(3) organization. In order to clarify the types of experience that we are looking for in ACMUI members, the Commission has directed the staff to review and update, as necessary, the descriptions of all the ACMUI specialties and functions, including a short description of the desired experience and qualifications for each position. This information will be posted on the NRC's public website and the staff will ensure that the descriptions will be routinely updated to reflect the most current needs of the ACMUI. The information you provided in your October 13, 2008, letter does not pertain to the current ACMUI patients' rights advocate, and does not alter our view, as expressed in our June 11 and August 11, 2008, letters to you, that the current patients' rights advocate effectively represents patients' perspectives on the ACMUI.
