Enclosed is a copy of the license condition requiring compliance with 10 CFR 20.2207 (Reports of transactions involving nationally tracked sources). We plan to amend the licenses of all entities possessing quantities of radioactive material in excess of the limits described in Appendix E to 10 CFR Part 20 to include this condition. We believe that adoption of this requirement satisfies the compatibility and health and safety categories established in the Office of Federal and State Materials and Environmental Management Programs (FSME) Procedure SA-200.

The licensee shall comply with the initial inventory reporting requirement in 10 CFR 20.2207(h) for nationally tracked sources by January 31, 2009. Effective January 31, 2009, the licensee shall also comply with reporting requirements for transactions involving nationally tracked sources in 10 CFR 20.2207, including the requirement to report manufacture, transfer, receipt, disassembly, or disposal of any nationally tracked source allowed by this license, by the close of the next business day after the transaction. The term "nationally tracked source", as used in this license condition, is defined in 10 CFR 20.1003, referencing those radioactive materials and thresholds listed in Appendix E to 10 CFR Part 20 – "Nationally Tracked Source Thresholds".
