AMENDMENT OF "LICENSING OF PRODUCTION AND UTILIZATION FACILITIES, 10 CFR 50

Dear Mr. Burman:

Reference is made to your application for exemption from 10 CFR 50 dated January 5, 1961.

Enclosed is a copy of an amendment to the Coumission's regulation "Licensing of Production and Utilization Facilities", 10 CFR 50 which has been filed with the Office of the Federal Register. Enclosed also is a copy of "AEC Analysis of Appropriate Limits for Exemption".

The amendment is intended to exempt the processing of slightly irradiated uranium from the licensing requirements of Part 50. Such processing, however, will still be subject to the requirements of Part 30 "Licensing of Byproduct Material" and Part 70 "Special Nuclear Material".

Upon the basis of the information furnished in your application for exemption, the content of fission product and level of activity of the 24 slightly irradiated fuel and control elements being returned by the Natherlands Government fall within the limits prescribed in the enclosed amendment to Part 50.

Under separate cover we are transmitting an appropriate revision of License SNM-98 under which the Notherlands elements may be processed.
