Dear Mr. O'Neil:

Your waste shipment under the above described purchase order was received at this installation on June 18, 1962.

When the waste was unloaded, the trailer was checked and found generally contaminated on the floor up to .5 mr/hr beta-gamma and 290 d/m/100 cm² alpha on smears. Contamination apparently was caused by corrosion which came from the containers.

Since we encountered some difficulty with a previous shipment received from your installation on April 27, 1962, we suggest that you review your packing procedures to determine cause and find some suitable method of correcting this condition.

Please advise if we can be of any assistance.

After the wastes were unloaded, the trailer was checked and found generally contaminated on the floor up to .5 mr/hr beta-gamma and 290 d/m/100 cm2 alpha on smears.

The trailer was decontaminated below maximum permissible levels before being released to commercial channels.
