VISIT TO ENGELHARD INSUTRIES, INC., NEWARK, N.J., REGARDING TER-  
MINATION OF LICENSE NO. SNM-98

On 10/25/63, Mr. Lorenz, Radiation Specialist, visited Mr. Auchmoody, Assistant Plant Manager, regarding the above subject. This visit was made to determine the current status of their facility with respect to termination of their SNM-98 license. Mr. Auchmoody stated that approximately two months ago Radiological Services of Valley Stream, L.I., removed all equipment used in connection with processing of material under SNM-98. Removal of this equipment was accomplished by Radiological Services during the period when this company was decontaminating facilities (Buildings "U" and "P") and removing contaminated equipment used in conjunction with contract work performed for NYOO.

A tour through Building T revealed that the trays contained in three hoods, noted in our memo survey report to Headquarters dated May 8, 1963, had been disposed of together with the three filters, filter boxes, and associated duct work formerly mounted on the roof at Building T. The inspector noted, on touring the storage building, ("stone" Building), that equipment formerly used for processing material under SNM-98 had been removed, except for one storage rack, two tables, and one washing machine. The storage rack, as previously reported in the memo dated 5/8/63, was within the limits specified in L&R's letter to the licensee dated 6/18/62. The transite covers of the two tables had been disposed of and a survey of the tables at the time of the visit indicated no levels of radiation or contamination. The washing machine, because of its shape, was not possible to completely survey and should be treated as containing special nuclear material. Since this washing machine must be considered as containing special nuclear material, the machine should be disposed of accordingly, as specified in L&R's letter to the licensee dated 12/6/62. Auchmoody stated that the washing machine would be disposed through Radiological Services.
