Subject: Report of Lost Tritium Exit Signs & Corrective Report

Dear Dr. Miller:

Pursuant to 10 CFR § 31.5(a), Wal-Mart Stores, Inc. ("Wal-Mart") is a general licensee of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission because it possesses and uses byproduct material in the form of tritium exit signs ("TES") in various states subject to NRC regulation. Consistent with 10 CFR §§ 31.5(c)(10) and 20.2201(a)(ii), Wal-Mart is providing the subject report regarding eleven TES lost from multiple store locations, and one TES, previously reported as lost, that has been found.

Wal-Mart Stores, Inc. ("Wal-Mart") has employed the Shaw Group, Inc. ("Shaw"), an environmental services contractor with extensive experience in the management of radioactive material, for its company-wide program to inventory and replace TES with non-tritium exit signs. Wal-Mart has arranged for the return of all of Wal-Mart's TES to a specific licensee authorized to receive TES for disposal, and also has engaged a team of health physicists from Dade Moeller & Associates to properly handle damaged TES and conduct radiological surveys, as necessary.

Each TES listed below was installed when Shaw conducted its TES inventory at the stores, but was not found when Shaw returned to replace the TES with non-tritium exit signs:



Wal-Mart had no prior information that these TES had been transferred. In addition to the physical searches conducted by Shaw, both Wal-Mart and Shaw representatives conducted interviews with store personnel and reviewed shipment and inventory records, but were not able to learn any additional information about the location or condition of the lost TES. As a result of those investigations, Wal-Mart determined that these TES were lost. Promptly thereafter, the Wal-Mart Radiation Safety Officer reported the loss of the TES by telephone to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. At this time, Wal-Mart has no additional information regarding the whereabouts of these TES; they remain lost.

In addition, on October 16, 2008, Wal-Mart provided a written report that TES with serial number 368230 was lost from store number 1655 in Crawfordsville, Indiana. On November 6, 2008, Wal-Mart found that TES at the Crawfordsville store and transferred it to a specific licensee authorized to receive TES for disposal. A report of that transfer was sent under separate cover.
