A hard copy of this document should have been sent to you already. Please refer to Table 1, Attachment 2, page 19 of 19, especially and note the activity thresholds listed for materials commonly included in 10 CFR 35.500.

At this time please specify a possession limit for the material listed in Subitem No. 6. through 9. F. We must now review license applications and prepare license documents in accordance with this RIS and the requested information is necessary to complete that review. You may reference this as "additional information to control number 317481" and put it to my attention.

This information is needed within 30 days of the date of this letter. Please call me to discuss an alternative response arrangement, if necessary, at 630-829-9841.

2. **At this time I added several documents to your final, "tie-down" Condition, No. 21, in order to update it for compliance with commitments made by you with respect to the Increased Controls and Fingerprinting Orders. In addition, Condition Nos. 10.C. and 13. reference certain documents by date that were not part of Condition No. 21 and should be, so I added them also. These documents appear in bold font.**
3. **I corrected Subitem No. 9.G. to reflect that the installed activity in your HDR device may not exceed 10 curies, which is the limit imposed by the Food and Drug Administration at this time. If my understanding is incorrect, please contact me at the telephone number above immediately.**
4. **Subitem No. 8.C. shows your possession limit for unsealed iodine-131 is ten curies. Please change this possession limit to a value that is less than ten curies, relates to your actual usage needs and includes waste streams as well. We will need this information within 30 days of the date of this letter also. Please see section 1 above for response information or contact**

5. **This amendment appeared to result from the incorporation of naturally occurring or accelerator produced material (NARM) into your license, as a result of NRC's expanded jurisdiction and the expiration of the implementation waiver in Indiana.**
6. **Please advise us and request amendment of your license if, after a thorough review of your radiation safety program, you find that there are other areas or locations of use or other radiation safety elements that merit amendment as a result of NRC's regulation of NARM.**

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system.
