SUBJECT: NRC ROUTINE INSPECTION REPORT NO. 030-37585/08-01(DNMS)
AND NOTICE OF VIOLATION – WOS TESTING COMPANY, INC.

Dear Mr. Wos:

This refers to the inspection conducted on November 20, 2008, with continuing NRC review through December 30, 2008. The in-office review included an assessment of the circumstances surrounding a change in address at your Iowa facility. This inspection was an examination of activities conducted under your license as they relate to safety and compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and with the conditions of your license. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selected examination of procedures and representative records, observations of activities, and interviews with personnel.

Based on the results of the inspection, the NRC has determined that one Severity Level IV violation of NRC requirements occurred which concerns the licensee's failure to change its mailing address on Condition 2 of License No. 14-26385-01. Specifically, the licensee had changed its mailing address from 1347 O Avenue N.E.; Cedar Rapids, Iowa 52402 to 1958 West River Drive; Davenport, Iowa 52802 in September 2008 without NRC review and approval. The violation was evaluated in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. The current Enforcement Policy is included on the NRC's Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/enforcement-pol.html>. The violation is being cited in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). The violation is being cited in the Notice because it was identified by the NRC and not corrected by the licensee in a timely manner.

You are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice when preparing your response. For your consideration and convenience, an excerpt from NRC Information Notice 96-28, "Suggested Guidance Relating to Development and Implementation of Corrective Action," is enclosed. The NRC will use your response, in part, to determine whether further enforcement action is necessary to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter, its enclosures, and your response will be made available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC's document system (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/readingrm/adams.html>. To the extent possible, your response should not include any personal privacy, proprietary, or safeguards information so that it can be made available to the Public without redaction.

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NOTICE OF VIOLATION

WOS Testing Company, Inc.

During an NRC inspection conducted November 20, 2008, with continuing NRC in-office review through December 20, 2008, one violation of NRC requirements was identified. In accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy, the violation is listed below:

Condition 2 of License No. 14-26385-01 states the licensee's mailing address was 1347 O Avenue N.E.; Cedar Rapids, Iowa 52402.

Contrary to the above as of October 2008, the licensee's mailing address was not 1347 O Avenue N.E.; Cedar Rapids, Iowa 52402. Specifically, the licensee had changed its mailing address to 1958 West River Drive; Davenport, Iowa 52802 without changing the Condition on the license.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement IV).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, WOS Testing Company, Inc. is hereby required to submit a written statement or explanation to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, DC 20555-0001, with a copy to the Regional Administrator, Region III within 30 days of the date of the letter transmitting this Notice of Violation (Notice). This reply should be clearly marked as a "Reply to a Notice of Violation" and should include for each violation: (1) the reason for the violation, or, if contested, the basis for disputing the violation or severity level, (2) the corrective steps that have been taken and the results achieved, (3) the corrective steps that will be taken to avoid further violations, and (4) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Your response may reference or include previous docketed correspondence, if the correspondence adequately addresses the required response. If an adequate reply is not received within the time specified in this Notice, an order or a Demand for Information may be issued as to why the license should not be modified, suspended, or revoked, or why such other action as may be proper should not be taken. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending the response time.

If you contest this enforcement action, you should also provide a copy of your response, with the basis for your denial, to the Director, Office of Enforcement, United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, DC 20555-0001.

Your response will be made available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC's document system (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>. Therefore, to the extent possible, the response should not include any personal privacy, proprietary, or safeguards information so that it can be made available to the Public without redaction.

In accordance with 10 CFR 19.11, you may be required to post this Notice within two working days.
