

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SOP 500: PUBLIC ALERTING AND NOTIFICATION PROCEDURES

1.0 OBJECTIVE

SOP 500 Series contains procedures to be implemented to inform the general public of an emergency at Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations (SHCGS).

SOP 501 PROMPT ALERT AND NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

1.0 OBJECTIVE

The objective of this procedure is to describe the methods by which the Prompt Alert and Notification System is:

- 1.1 Activated in the event of a radiological accident requiring public response (implementation of protective actions) at Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations (SHCGS);
- 1.2 Deactivated in the event of a false or spurious activation;
- 1.3 Tested in conformance with Appendix 3 of NUREG-654, FEMA-REP-1, Rev. 1.

SOP 501-A SYSTEM PROCEDURES

1.0 GENERAL

1.1 SYSTEM DESCRIPTION

The prompt Alert and Notification System for an emergency at Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations is an integrated system consisting of:

- 1.1.1 Land-based alerting systems, SOP 501,
- 1.1.2 Specialized river and bay alert and notification equipment and procedures described in Procedure SOP 503,
- 1.1.3 Backup mobile route alerting procedures for the land based sirens described in Procedure SOP 504,
- 1.1.4 Emergency Alert System (EAS) as described in a Procedure SOP 502.

1.2 LAND-BASED SIRENS

The primary ALERTING system for an emergency at Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations includes 37 land-based sirens distributed within the 10-mile Emergency Planning Zone (EPZ) in Delaware to provide saturation for the area without coverage "dead spots". The sirens are activated and tested as a single unit system by the Delaware State Police Headquarters Communications Center (DSP-HQCC) personnel (a 24 hour a day/7 day a week operation) upon receipt of proper authorization (with authentication code) by state authorities. Transmission of encoded tones generated from an encoder, which activates the system, is computer monitored at the DSP-HQCC. The computerized monitoring system reports any systems or sirens failure necessitating the need for activation of back-up procedures.

1.3 MOBILE ROUTE ALERTING

If a siren(s) should fail to activate, volunteer fire companies within the EPZ have been instructed and equipped to expedite mobile route alerting of the area left uncovered with manual public address systems and pre-scripted messages described in Procedure SOP 504. In New Castle County, the NCCP may support the volunteer fire companies, if necessary, for back-up route alerting.

1.4 RIVER AND BAY ALERT AND NOTIFICATION

Specialized procedures have been developed to alert both commercial and sporting users of the Delaware River and Bay within the EPZ. Specially equipped helicopters operated by the DSP and Delaware National Guard (DNG) will be deployed to fly pre-designated routes along the water broadcasting a pre-recorded message alerting boaters, fishermen and hunters of a radiological accident at the Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations. Boats operated by the Division of Fish & Wildlife (DFW) will assist and back-up the helicopters in the alert mission described in Procedure SOP 503. Additional notification information will be broadcast over Marine Channel 16 and the National Weather Service Network with coverage in the area.

1.5 EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM (EAS)

The EAS encompasses commercial radio broadcasters in the State of Delaware. EAS expedites the notification of Delaware's population during times of emergency. Procedures have been developed for a radiological emergency at Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations as described in the State of Delaware Procedure SOP 502. For a radiological emergency, the EAS is activated by the Governor of the State of Delaware, the Director of DEMA, or their designees by a fax sheet or telephone message to the EAS Gateway Station, WDEL/WSTW, followed by a press release. These messages will be aired over participating radio stations notifying Delaware's population affected by the emergency of protective actions within their jurisdiction.

2.0 ACTIVATION PROCEDURES

- 2.1** If prompt alert and notification of the general public becomes necessary as a result of a radiological emergency at Salem-Hope Nuclear Generating Stations during regular working hours 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, the land-based siren, river alert and notification system and EAS will be activated by the Governor of Delaware or the Director of DEMA or their designees by:
- 2.1.1** Calling the DSP Communications Center providing authorization using authentication code to activate the land based sirens, in accordance with procedures specified in the PSEG Nuclear Training Department Manual maintained at the Delaware State Police Headquarters Communication Center (DSP-HQCC).
 - 2.1.2** Calling the following participating River and Bay Alert and Notification Agencies (USCG, ACE, DFW, DSP, DNG) to stage equipment and personnel upon declaration of an ALERT EMERGENCY ACTION LEVEL at the Salem/Hope Creek Generating Stations.
 - 2.1.3** Calling the EAS Gateway Station WDEL/WSTW and providing proper authorization (authentication code), specified in the State of Delaware Procedure SOP 502.
- 2.2** In the event the prompt alert and notification system must be activated during hours when the State EOC is not staffed (weekends, holidays and from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. Monday through Friday), either the Governor of Delaware, the Director of DEMA or their designees will direct activation of the land-based siren, river alert and notification system and EAS, after having been notified of a radiological emergency at the Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations.
- 2.2.1** Authorize activation of the Land-Based Sirens by the DSP-HQCC personnel.

2.2 (Continued)

2.2.2 During an off-hours incident either the Governor of the State of Delaware, the Director of DEMA or their designees must activate EAS within a timely manner of deciding to activate the Land-Based Sirens with a call, providing proper authorization (authentication code) to the EAS Gateway Station WDEL/WSTW. EAS can be activated earlier in a radiological emergency at SHCGS upon receipt of an ALERT EMERGENCY ACTION LEVEL declaration by PSEG. EAS is also activated to notify Delawareans within the EPZ of a spurious activation of the Land-Based Sirens. The EAS can be activated 24 hours per day upon receipt of proper authorization and telephone verification.

2.2.3 The Delaware River and Bay Alert and Notification system will be staged upon declaration of an ALERT EMERGENCY ACTION LEVEL at Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations with activation calls to the USCG, ACE, DFW, DSP and DNG as described in Procedure SOP 503. When notified of a Site Area Emergency Action Level declaration at the SHCGS, all river and bay alert and notification personnel and equipment will be deployed to complete their prescribed mission.

3.0 DEACTIVATION PROCEDURES

Should it become necessary for the DSP to deactivate the land-based siren system, appropriate procedures are described in the PSEG Nuclear Training Department Manual maintained at the Delaware State Police Headquarters Communication Center (DSP-HQCC).

4.0 SYSTEM TESTING

4.1 The land-based siren system is tested at the direction of the Director of DEMA or designee by the DSP-HQCC in conformance with the guidance established in Appendix 3 of NUREG-0654, FEMA- REP-1, Rev. 1. Delaware's land-based siren system includes a computer monitoring capacity that generates a report of appropriate siren system activation and information. This testing includes VERIFY, TEST CYCLE and COMPLETE CYCLE tests according to the following schedule:

4.1.1 Silent (VERIFY) test daily,

4.1.2 Full (COMPLETE CYCLE) cycle tests quarterly

4.2 The River Alert and Notification System is tested biennially as required by FEMA.

4.3 State of Delaware EAS Manual Procedures for Radiological Emergencies at Salem-Hope Creek Nuclear Generating Stations are tested biennially as required by FEMA.

(Continued)**

5.0 SPURIOUS OR ACCIDENTAL ACTIVATION EVENT PROCEDURE (See SOP 102)

Spurious or accidental activations are those which occur for reasons known or unknown other than a planned activation from the DSP-HQCC activation point.

- 5.1 In the event of a spurious or accidental activation, the DSP-HQCC staff shall first attempt to deactivate the affected siren(s) by depressing the CANCEL button on the activation encoder. If this action does not deactivate the siren(s), DSP-HQCC will dispatch a state trooper to manually deactivate the siren at its specific location. The computer-monitoring interface will generate an appropriate report including spurious siren activations and/or system failures.
- 5.2 Following the above corrective action, the DEMA Duty Officer will be notified by DSP-HQCC to activate EAS by calling to the EAS Gateway Station WDEL/WSTW for broadcast of the appropriate pre-scripted message.
- 5.3 Should the corrective actions described in 5.1 above prove the siren needs repair, DSP-HQCC will call the appropriate contractor to inspect the siren and take any corrective measures. Once the siren is repaired, the DSP-HQCC will file a report with the DEMA Duty Officer verifying the siren is operational. DEMA and DSP-HQCC will test the siren as described previously herein.

6.0 SIREN SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

The Land-Based Siren System will be inspected in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions, specified in the owner's manual. At the completion of this inspection, the organization responsible for the maintenance of the siren system will file a report on the condition of the system to the DEMA Duty Officer.

7.0 SIREN SYSTEM ACTIVATION REPORTS

Delaware's Land-Based Siren System includes a computer-monitoring interface that provides appropriate activation information upon transmission of any signal (ALERT or CANCEL). Additionally, these reports include siren failure information.

SOP 502 EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM (EAS) MESSAGES

SOP 502-A MESSAGE CONSTRUCTION

1.0 GENERAL

- 1.1. The content of these messages is created by the computerized Emergency Management Network (EMNet) program or a typed information sheet. EMNET is located in three (3) separate areas at the State EOC DEMA Operations, Delaware State Police Communications Center and the Department of Transportation, Transportation Management Center. The EMNET program is menu-driven for ease of operation.
- 1.2 DEMA PIO or designee, upon calling the Emergency Alert System (EAS) Gateway Station WDEL/WSTW, may use EMNet, dictate or fax the EAS message to the station personnel. DEMA PIO or designee will monitor the station and record the time the EAS tones are sent.
- 1.3 All EAS messages should follow this format:
 - 1.3.1 A preamble message
 - 1.3.2 The generating station with the incident
 - 1.3.3 Public action guidelines
 - 1.3.4 Area(s) affected
 - 1.3.5 Message
- 1.4 After composing the press release, it must be reviewed by the DEMA Director, TAC Chair and Operations Chief.

2.0 INSTRUCTIONS

This section is divided into sub-sections correlating to the format described above.

2.1 EAS PREAMBLE MESSAGE

THE FOLLOWING MESSAGE, RECEIVED FROM THE DELAWARE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY, IS FROM THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE. NEW JERSEY RESIDENTS SHOULD TUNE TO THEIR EAS STATION FOR INFORMATION CONCERNING THEIR STATE.

SOP 503-A: JURISDICTION AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1.0 GENERAL

- 1.1 The area to be alerted consists of the waterways within 10 miles of Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations (SHCGS), including parts of the Delaware River, its tributaries and the Chesapeake and Delaware (C&D) Canal. (See Attachment 503-A1)
- 1.2 Commercial vessels, foreign and domestic, of ocean-type draft pass within two miles of SHCGS in the ship channel which extends from the mouth of the Delaware River to Trenton, New Jersey.
- 1.3 During the periods of fall to mid-winter (prime hunting season) and summer (prime fishing season), there may be as many as 800-1,000 people in the wildlife refuge areas.
- 1.4 During the summer months, Pea Patch Island is a very popular recreation area and may host as many as 1,000 transients who are brought by boat from Delaware City and Fort Mott, New Jersey to the site. In the event of an evacuation order, this population would need to be evacuated.

2.0 JURISDICTION

- 2.1 The Delaware River, in the vicinity of Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations (SHCGS), lies between the States of Delaware and New Jersey. Immediately north of SHCGS, the river is principally under the jurisdiction of Delaware. South of SHCGS, the jurisdiction is approximately equally shared by both states.
- 2.2 The United States Coast Guard (USCG) has federal jurisdiction over commercial and pleasure vessels in the navigable waters of the United States and is the primary agent responsible for alert and notification for the Delaware River and Bay.
- 2.3 The United States Army Corps of Engineers (ACE) has jurisdiction on the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal.
- 2.4 The Delaware Division of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) patrols the waterways, inlets, coves, wildlife refuges and marine features in this area. Areas under the DFW jurisdiction within the 10-mile EPZ are Reedy Island, Augustine Wildlife Area and Beach (Appoquinimink Wildlife Area and Bayview are a part of Augustine Wildlife Area), Woodland Beach Wildlife Area, Collins Beach and Cedar Swamp.
- 2.5 The Delaware Division of Parks and Recreation (DPR) maintains public recreation areas and beaches along the Delaware River. Areas under DPR jurisdiction to be alerted are Fort Delaware State Park (Pea Patch Island), Fort DuPont State Park and the reservation surrounding the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal within the 10-mile EPZ.
- 2.6 The State of New Jersey has jurisdiction roughly just south of Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations from the center of the Delaware River eastward to the shore.

**SOP 503-A: JURISDICTION AND RESPONSIBILITIES
(Continued)**

3.0 RESPONSIBILITIES

Manpower and equipment will be staged at the Alert emergency action level. The Alert and Notification System will be activated at the Site Area Emergency Action level. Weather, safety, plant conditions and other factors may cause deviation from this plan.

- 3.1 The USCG is the primary agency responsible for alert and notification for the Delaware Bay/River. To meet this need the USCG maintains the USCG Captain of the Port, Philadelphia Radiological Emergency Response Plan for Salem, Hope Creek and Oyster Creek Generating Stations. The USCG supports the alerting response needs of the State.
- 3.2 The ACE is responsible for alert and notification of commercial marine traffic on the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal.
- 3.3 The DFW is responsible for coordination of all Delaware surface alert and notification activities on the river and bay. This includes all land and sea activities by DFW, DPR, USCG, ACE, and DSP.
- 3.4 The DPR coordinates all activities on state park and wildlife areas with the DFW.
- 3.5 The DSP Aviation and the DNG are responsible for alert and notification for the Delaware Bay/River by helicopter. Delaware River and Bay Authority (DRBA) will be back-up for DSP or DNG if needed.
- 3.6 The DNG is responsible for coordination of all airborne operations of the DNG and DSP helicopters during the time they are actually engaged in the prescribed flight paths. The DSP helicopter remains under DSP control, with one exception - an order to "cancel the mission and immediately evacuate the area" should be responded to for crew safety.
- 3.7 The Wilmington Fire Company and local fire companies will be contacted for auxiliary support by the DFW as necessary.
- 3.8 The New Jersey Marine Law Enforcement Bureau will provide back-up support to the Delaware DFW for the inland waters of the New Jersey shore within the ten-mile EPZ in the event the helicopters can not fly.

4.0 COMMUNICATIONS

Following notification by the Delaware Emergency Management Agency (DEMA) of an emergency (Alert, Site Area Emergency, General Emergency) at Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations, the following communication interfaces will be established:

- 4.1 The Division of Fish and Wildlife (DFW), Enforcement Section Northern Captain, will telephone the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) and verify radio notification will be initiated on Marine VHF Radio Channel 16.

**SOP 503-A: JURISDICTION AND RESPONSIBILITIES
(Continued)**

4.0 COMMUNICATIONS (Continued)

- 4.2** All units will be put on alert and activation standby, requested to report to duty stations to prepare helicopters and boats for an impending mission at the Site Area Emergency Action Level.
- 4.3** If telephone contact in any instance is not completed, the initial back-up communication method to be used is marine channel 16. Once contact is established on marine channel 83, communications will be switched to either channel 22 or 83. Marine channel 83 will be used to issue appropriate warning and protective action messages to boaters and commercial traffic on the Delaware River.
- 4.4** DNG and DSP helicopters will report their locations using designated checkpoints (Attachment 503-A2) over FM 46.9, with Marine channel 83 as backup radio channel.

SOP 503-B: AGENCY SUMMARY PROCEDURES

1.0 U.S. COAST GUARD (USCG)

- 1.1 Dispatch a representative to Delaware's State Emergency Operations Center to coordinate alert and notification, search and rescue and evacuation procedures for waterways affected by a radiological emergency at the Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations (SHCGS).
- 1.2 Notify vessels, in the waterway area within the ten-mile Plume Pathway Emergency Planning Zone (EPZ).
- 1.3 Issue a "NOTICE TO MARINERS" over Marine channel 16.
- 1.4 Use USCG patrol boats and aerial helicopter support to locate and notify vessels that are not radio equipped. Depending on weather conditions and the area to be alerted, the USCG will deploy a helicopter from its station and request additional aerial helicopter support from the State of Delaware to alert vessels via voice broadcasts.
- 1.5 Maintain access control operations by establishing a safety zone perimeter for vessels, upon request, to prevent shipping and boaters from entering affected waters. The USCG will control zones of passage and will broadcast on Marine channel 16 and bands appropriate to the vessel class being contacted, and will notify bay pilots and local shipping concerns.
- 1.6 Alert pleasure craft.

2.0 U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS (ACE)

- 2.1 Notify the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal Project Superintendent, or his alternate and the Maintenance Foreman of alerting requirements. Contact will be made by telephone or Marine emergency radio frequency. Canal administration is located in Chesapeake City where 24-hour communication facilities are maintained. During non-normal working hours, messages will be received and forwarded by the Dispatcher on duty.
- 2.2 Dispatch a representative to Delaware's State Emergency Operations Center to coordinate alert & notification, search & rescue and evacuation procedures for waterways affected by a radiological emergency at the Salem-Hope Creek Generation Stations.
- 2.3 Alert commercial vessels traversing the Canal using Marine channel 13. The ACE has complete television surveillance of the length of the Canal and is able to stop commercial traffic where and when necessary. The Reservation area surrounding the Canal in Delaware is under the jurisdiction of both the DPR and the ACE as noted in the appended alerting area documents.
- 2.4 Take necessary measures to control canal traffic to effectively implement the alert as appropriate according to the DFW message and appropriate areas as detailed in the appended alerting area documents.

SOP 503-B: AGENCY SUMMARY PROCEDURES (Continued)

3.0 DIVISION OF FISH AND WILDLIFE (DFW)

- 3.1 Using its call list, the DFW will mobilize its staff to alert fishermen, sportsmen and other transients. Game wardens and other personnel in Division vehicles will notify the public by direct contact, mobile, and/or fixed public address systems.
- 3.2 Provide notification information to pleasure craft occupants, fishermen, and transients by public address systems from boats and/or motor vehicles, by personal contact, or by Marine band or citizens band radio, in the estuaries, inlets, coves, and other marine areas on and adjoining the river shore. This area includes the area of the river within a ten mile radius from the Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations specifically, from the north end of Pea Patch Island to the Woodland Beach Wildlife Area and inland waterways on the Delaware side of the river (Woodland Beach, Smyrna River, Cedar Swamp, Collins Beach, Appoquinimink River and Blackbird Creek). Marinas in the affected areas will be contacted by telephone to intercept departing traffic.
- 3.3 Coordinate all alert and notification efforts.

4.0 DIVISION OF PARKS AND RECREATION (DPR)

- 4.1 The Park Superintendent or alternate, the Assistant Park Superintendent, will alert the public within the park employing motor vehicles, direct contact and fixed public address systems and the aid of Park Ranger Staff.
- 4.2 The DPR will coordinate with the DPR and the DFW representatives at the State EOC.

5.0 DELAWARE STATE POLICE (DSP)

- 5.1 The DSP Aviation crew will be notified at the ALERT Emergency Action Level and dispatched to begin operations at the Site Area Emergency Action Level. DSP Aviation crew will coordinate with the DSP representative at the State EOC.
- 5.2 The DSP helicopter and crews stationed at the Summit Airport have been equipped and instructed for carrying out this mission. Upon becoming airborne to execute this mission, the DSP pilot will attempt to establish radio contact with the DNG by FM 46.90, or Marine channel 83. The purpose will be to obtain the status and location of the DNG helicopter, and to report the checkpoints along the DSP flight path. This information will be readily available to the DSP liaison personnel at the DEMA EOC since the DSP and DNG representatives occupy adjoining communications booths. DNG call signs are: DELTA 15 (State EOC Location), DELTA 7 (DNG HQs. Location).
- 5.3 The DSP estimates response time for aerial alert and notification as follows:

Active Duty - Eight A.M. to Midnight

- * 2 - 5 minutes for pilots and crew to reach craft
- * No prep time
- * 12 - 15 minutes to reach the Delaware River

On Call - Midnight to Eight A.M.

- * Less than 1 hour for pilot to reach craft
- * No prep time
- * 12 - 15 minutes to reach the Delaware River

(Continued)**

5.0 DELAWARE STATE POLICE (DSP) (Continued)

5.5 In coordinating the joint flight of DNG and DSP aircraft, all aircraft will report their position and progress to the State EOC DNG Liaison Officer. Checkpoint names, locations, and reporting requirements are listed in Attachment 503-A2.

6.0 DELAWARE NATIONAL GUARD (DNG)

6.1 This is a support mission only. The U.S. Coast Guard retains primary responsibility for Alert/Notification of personnel and shipping in the EPZ on the Delaware Bay.

6.2 Performance of this mission is contingent upon weather/flying conditions, both for crew response and crew safety. The Commander, Army Aviation Support Facility is the final approving authority for practice, or actual execution of this mission.

6.3 The minimum response time for this mission is susceptible to such factors as weather, time, day of week, and absence of equipment, i.e., a unit at Annual Training. Therefore the term response time is that time from receipt of the alert requirement by the Army Aviation Support Facility (AASF) Commander, until the first aircraft takes off on the mission. The anticipated minimum response times, for planning purposes are:

 During Regular Duty Hours 1.5 hours

 During Non-Duty Hours 4 hours

 It is an inherent responsibility of the Delaware Emergency Management Agency to provide sufficient warning to accommodate these times.

6.4 The DNG helicopter crew will be notified at the ALERT Emergency Action Level to stage and will be dispatched to begin operations at the Site Area Emergency Action Level. The helicopter crew will include a target spotter.

6.5 Performance of this mission, exercise or actual, will be in a State Active Duty Status under Title 20 Delaware Code.


6.6 Direct coordination between Commander (CDR), AASF and Captain of the Port of Philadelphia (USCG) for the coordination is authorized and encouraged.

6.7 In coordinating the joint flight of DNG and DSP aircraft, all aircraft will report their position and progress to State EOC DNG Liaison Officer. Checkpoint names, locations, and reporting requirements are listed in Attachment 503-A2.

6.8 Unless otherwise specified, DNG aircraft will fly Route 1 (Red Route) at an altitude of 500 feet.

SOP 504: ROUTE ALERTING PROCEDURE FOR FAILED SIRENS

1.0 OBJECTIVE

This procedure describes route alerting responsibilities and methods to inform the public of an emergency at Salem-Hope Creek Generating Stations (SHCGS) in case of a siren failure within the ten mile EPZ.

2.0 CONTENTS

3.0 PREREQUISITES

3.1 An emergency condition exists which requires public notification and instruction.

3.2 A siren failure(s) has occurred.

5.0 ATTACHMENTS

6.0 RECORDS

All data, records, forms and logs are to be transmitted to and maintained by DEMA at the State EOC for historical files.

SOP 504-A ROUTE ALERTING PROCEDURE

1.0 RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1.1 Fire Chief (or designee) is responsible for overall coordination of emergency route alerting in his/her district as outlined in step-by-step procedure below:
- 1.1.1 Alert firefighters to respond to station according to established procedures, if not already accomplished.
 - 1.1.2 Give briefing to firefighters including weather and emergency conditions and siren failures.
 - 1.1.3 Issue self-protection kits to teams.
 - 1.1.4 Instruct firefighters to check equipment and fill-out forms in emergency worker kits (See SOP 801).
 - 1.1.5 Assign teams to vehicles and routes with sufficient units to cover required area for each malfunctioning siren.
 - 1.1.6 Issue maps of the appropriate areas if not already in the response vehicle (Attachment 504-A).
 - 1.1.7 Review routes and procedure with firefighters.
 - 1.1.8 Identify location of deaf or hearing impaired persons within the affected area(s).
 - 1.1.9 Inform Fireboard when vehicles begin and finish route alerting.
 - 1.1.10 Monitor emergency worker radiation exposure.

2.0 INSTRUCTIONS

Firefighters are responsible for route alerting assignments as outlined in the step-by-step procedure below:

- 2.1 Upon receipt of a 10-72 (Mobilize for major emergency) during a radiological emergency, fire company personnel will assemble at the fire station and wait for further instructions from the Fire Chief or designee.
- 2.2 Receive briefing on emergency and weather conditions.
- 2.3 Check equipment in self-protection kits and fill-out forms (see SOP 801).
- 2.4 Receive vehicle and route assignment.
- 2.5 Review maps (Attachment 504-A).
- 2.6 Perform radio check and inform dispatcher when beginning route.
- 2.7 Turn on emergency lights.

SOP 504-A ROUTE ALERTING PROCEDURE (Continued)

2.0 INSTRUCTIONS (Continued)

- 2.8 Go to designated area as quickly as practical.
- 2.9 Sound siren for five (5) seconds before each tape message is broadcast.
- 2.10 Play tape message over public address system. If tape system malfunctions broadcast the following message:

ATTENTION! ATTENTION!

**AN EMERGENCY SITUATION HAS OCCURRED AT THE
SALEM-HOPE CREEK GENERATING STATIONS. TUNE
YOUR RADIO TO AN EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM
STATION FOR FURTHER INSTRUCTIONS.**

- 2.11 Sound siren for five (5) seconds after each message is broadcast. Continue re-broadcasting, following steps 2.9 through 2.11.
- 2.12 Ensure that deaf, hearing impaired and other special populations persons along the route are notified by door to door contact.
- 2.13 Maintain 15 mph while driving route.
- 2.14 Read self-reading dosimeters every 15 minutes in accordance with self protection guidelines outlined in SOP 801.
- 2.15 Inform dispatcher when route is completed and receive additional instructions.
- 2.16 Go directly to Emergency Worker Decontamination Station following completion of assignment.

SOP 505: PUBLIC INFORMATION PROCEDURE

This procedure describes actions taken by the Public Information Officer (PIO), Emergency News Center and Joint Information Center Representative and Rumor Control Operators to provide accurate, timely and coordinated information to the public during a radiological emergency at a commercial nuclear power plant.

 - Seriousness of the emergency
 - Protective action decisions
 - Federal, State, Local and Private Response Radio and TV stations that will broadcast further emergency information
 - 1.4.3 Number press releases sequentially using alpha prefixes (PR-1, PR-2, PR-3, etc. for press releases).
 - 1.4.4 Put time and date on each press release.
 - 1.4.5 Have each press release approved and initialed by the DEMA Director.
- 1.5 Verify EOC telephone and telecopier numbers with the ENC Representative before dispatched to the ENC.
- 1.6 Acquire latest EAS message & press releases from DEMA PIO or alternate.
 - 1.6.1 Have DEMA Director review EAS messages prior to distribution.
- 1.7 Distribute approved press releases and EAS messages to the Image Port Fax List 300:
 - Governor's Press Secretary
 - DEMA Director
 - DEMA Operations Lead
 - TAC Chairperson
 - Rumor Control Operators

 - 1.11.1 Collect all logs, press releases, EAS messages, leads briefing form and provide to the Operations Lead for permanent record.
 - 1.11.2 Return work area to original condition.

2.0 EMERGENCY NEWS CENTER (ENC) AND JOINT INFORMATION CENTER (JIC) REPRESENTATIVE

- 2.1 Report to the State Emergency Operations Center (EOC).
- 2.2 Verify State EOC telephone and telecopier numbers before dispatch to the ENC and JIC.
- 2.3 Initiate and maintain a log of all activities including telephone calls (outgoing and incoming), telecopied information (outgoing and incoming), press releases, leads briefing form, EAS messages and news briefings.
- 2.4 Notify the DEMA Operations Chief or PIO of arrival.
- 2.5 Get a briefing from the Operations Chief or alternate.
- 2.6 Receive the appropriate press releases and EAS messages from the PIO.
- 2.7 Verify telephone and telecopier numbers with the PIO who will provide press releases leads briefing form and EAS messages throughout the activation.
- 2.8 Proceed to the Emergency News Center and Joint Information Center for appropriate nuclear plant with identification card, self-protection equipment, approved news release if available and pertinent telephone/telecopier numbers.
- 2.9 Communicate via car radio or cellular phone while en route to Emergency News Center and Joint Information Center with DEMA Operations.
- 2.10 If a release is in progress, use self-protection equipment as described in SOP 800 Series.
- 2.11 Upon arrival at the Emergency News Center and Joint Information Center:
 - 2.11.1 Inform the Emergency News Center and Joint Information Center Manager of your arrival.
 - 2.11.2 If necessary request clerical person from ENC and JIC manager to answer Delaware telephones/radios while you are in news briefings and to provide clerical assistance if you have not brought support personnel.
 - 2.11.3 Set up communications. Ensure phones are placed into matching wall jacks. Test communication equipment (telephone, computer and fax machine). Inform the ENC and JIC manager if equipment is inoperable.



 - 3.6.2 Do not interject personal opinion.
 - 3.6.3 Be brief and courteous.
 - 3.6.4 Inform the caller that authorized emergency information can be obtained by listening to the Emergency Alert System (EAS) radio stations.
 - 3.6.5 If callers need emergency assistance, refer them to the 911 emergency phone number.
 - 3.6.6 If unable to answer a question, record their telephone number. Return call when information needed is gathered. PIO can provide assistance with answering or returning questions.
 - 3.6.7 Report any pattern of widespread rumors that should be corrected by the PIO.

Secure a clearly visible white cloth on the front door handle to indicate to emergency workers that you have been notified of the emergency and have left the area. Check with your neighbors to be sure they have heard the advisory. Take with you a change of clothing, prescription medicine and glasses.

Once the evacuation is complete, access to the area will be controlled by police.

This guidance is only applicable when a confirmed notification of a General Emergency *requiring urgent action* (“Fast Breaker”) has been received *and* the Technical Assessment Center (TAC) has not been activated. This procedure is intended to assist the DEMA Director and does not replace sound judgment during a radiological emergency.

Use the checklist in Attachment 600-A1 following this procedure for implementation.

2.5 Consider using EAS to inform the public of protective actions. Coordinate actions with the State of New Jersey and the utility

2.5.1 Review and authorize press releases.

2.6 Maintain contact with the Emergency Response Manager (ERM) or Emergency Coordinator (EC) at the utility.

2.7 Confer often with TAC Chairman. (Must meet with TAC when Emergency Classification Level changes, protective action recommendations are issued from the plant or TAC, or when deemed necessary by either party).

2.8 Review TAC Protective Action Recommendations (PAR's)



The Delaware Emergency Management Agency has issued an evacuation order.

Evacuees should remain calm and take only essential items. Evacuees should not go to schools to pick up children...they will be cared for at Relocation Centers in accordance with existing emergency plans and parents will be instructed on how to reunite with their children.

Leave pets at home with plenty of food and water unless you are staying with a friend or relative. Pets are not allowed in public shelters.

Lock windows and doors and shut off all appliances. Tape the **NOTIFIED** sign in your PSEG Emergency Information Calendar to an easily seen front window or door to tell emergency officials that you have evacuated. Offer rides to neighbors who are without transportation.

Emergency personnel will be posted at various points on evacuation routes. Evacuees should follow all instructions of emergency personnel and should continue to monitor the Emergency Alert System (EAS) for updated information and instructions.

SOP 700-A: DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1.0 GENERAL

Traffic and access control is designed to manage traffic patterns around areas affected by a radiological emergency, manage the traffic exiting the affected area and control the access to the affected area after evacuation.

2.0 TECHNICAL ASSESSMENT CENTER (TAC)

- 2.1 TAC is responsible for identifying the affected area.
- 2.2 TAC is responsible for notifying DEMA Operations if personnel exposure conditions at an access control point change or are projected to change.
- 2.3 TAC will also coordinate with DEMA Operations if relocation of an access control point is required.

3.0 DELAWARE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (DEMA)

- 3.1 DEMA is responsible for coordinating with the TAC and relaying information to the operations personnel and DEMA Director.
- 3.2 DEMA is responsible for coordinating traffic and access control operations with the following:
 - 3.2.1 Air – PSEG, FAA
 - 3.2.2 Rail - USDOT
 - 3.2.3 Water - DFW, DSP, DPR, ACE, USCG
 - 3.2.4 Auto/Truck - DSP, NCCDP, DH
 - 3.2.5 Wildlife/Parks - DFW, DPR, DH
 - 3.2.6 Emergency Facilities - DSP, NCCDP, DH, DNG

4.0 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (DelDOT)

- 4.1 DelDOT is responsible for placement and supply of traffic barriers and equipment at access control points.
- 4.2 DelDOT is responsible for placement and supply of traffic barriers and equipment to control traffic patterns.
- 4.3 DelDOT provides traffic barriers and equipment for traffic and access control at registration centers and relocation centers.

SOP 700-A: DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES (Continued)

5.0 DELAWARE STATE POLICE (DSP)

- 5.1 DSP is responsible for coordination and implementation of traffic and access control on roadways and other emergency facilities.
- 5.2 DSP provides necessary personnel to man all traffic and access control locations.
- 5.3 Pre-designated access control points have been identified approximating the five and ten-mile radius from SHCNGS (See Attachment 700-B1 and 700-B2) and include access control points on the new Route 1.

6.0 DIVISION OF PARKS AND RECREATION (DPR)

- 6.1 DPR will provide access control for all affected state parks.

7.0 DIVISION OF FISH AND WILDLIFE (DFW)

- 7.1 DFW will coordinate access control operations on Delaware waterways with DSP, DPR, USCG and ACE.
- 7.2 DFW will provide access control for all affected state wildlife areas.

8.0 NEW CASTLE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF POLICE (NCCDP)

- 8.1 NCCDP is responsible for supporting DSP in providing traffic and access control for roadways and other emergency facilities.

9.0 DELAWARE NATIONAL GUARD (DNG)

- 9.1 DNG will provide access control support on Delaware roads and emergency facilities as requested by DSP.

10.0 U.S. COAST GUARD (USCG)

- 10.1 USCG is responsible for access control on the Delaware River.
- 10.2 River access control is coordinated at the State EOC by DFW.

11.0 ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS (ACE)

- 11.1 ACE is responsible for access control on the Chesapeake and Delaware (C&D) Canal.

SOP 700-B: METHODS AND GUIDELINES

1.0 TRAFFIC CONTROL

1.1 AIR TRAFFIC

1.1.1 The control and routing of air traffic is coordinated with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and PSEG.

1.1.2 DEMA Operations provides the coordination and interface with the FAA.

1.2 RAIL TRAFFIC

1.2.1 The control and routing of rail traffic is coordinated with the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT).

1.2.2 DEMA Operations provides the coordination and interface with the USDOT.

1.3 WATER TRAFFIC

1.3.1 The control of water traffic is coordinated by the DFW with the USCG, DSP, DPR, and ACE at the State EOC.

1.3.2 Water traffic control is pre-designated in the SOP 500 Series Procedures.

1.4 AUTO/TRUCK TRAFFIC

1.4.1 The routing of traffic is coordinated through the State EOC, and implemented by DSP, supported by NCCDP.

1.4.2 Vehicle traffic is controlled at the specified registration centers, relocation centers, access control points and other emergency facilities.

1.5 WILDLIFE/PARKS

1.5.1 Access control is provided by DFW and DPR in the state parks and wildlife areas.

2.0 ACCESS CONTROL

2.1 Access control points are pre-designated and have an alert notification sign posted to ensure positive control of the ten-mile Emergency Planning Zone. The predetermined access control points are listed and displayed on Attachment 700-B1 and 700-B2.

2.2 DSP utilizes these locations to manage traffic exiting the affected area. Evacuees needing directions to Registration Centers should be provided a copy of the Evacuee Instruction Sheet contained in Attachment 700-B3.

2.3 When the affected area has been evacuated, only authorized personnel and equipment are allowed to enter.

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT LOCATIONS:

DEMA is exploring the merits of installing traffic management points at locations outside the 10-mile EPZ. These traffic management points would be used to initiate, control and expedite movement around the 10-mile EPZ. Establishment of traffic management points provides an action parallel and complimentary to activation of access control points. Both of these actions will be initiated in order to facilitate the orderly flow of traffic around/out of the affected area. Traffic management points will consist of the placement of trained traffic control officers, road barriers, signs and other traffic control aids at designated critical points to expedite a safe and orderly evacuation process.

US 13 and State Route 42 (divert traffic into Maryland in order to access US 301, US 40 or I-95)

US 13 and State Route 300/6

US 13 and US 40

US 13 and State Route 71

State Route 7 and State Route 71

Intersection of US 13 & the north Dover SR 1 exit

US 40 and State Route 1 (signs at both ramps)



Access Control Maps









