

**PROGRAM SCOPE**

This inspection was conducted as a follow-up to escalated enforcement. During a routine inspection in July 2008, the inspector identified a violation of 10 CFR 30.34(i), concerning the security of a portable gauge stored in a vehicle.

Licensee personnel demonstrated the storage of a gauge in a vehicle, and the inspector observed gauge security in the licensee's facility. The inspector noted that the licensee stored the gauge as described in their letter dated September 16, 2008, meeting the requirements of 10 CFR 30.34(i). Licensee personnel described the training that took place following identification of the violation to ensure that the personnel understood the application of the requirement. Based on this information, the inspector determined that the licensee has corrected the violation identified in the July 2008 inspection, and has implemented the corrective actions described in response to the violation. Because of this, the violation is considered closed.
