

CPNPP COLA RAI NUMBERING

Question Numbers:

Each question will have a unique question number. Each question number contains two parts:

- Section numbers
 - Follow the SRP/COLA FSAR section numbers
 - Use two digits (e.g. Chapter 1 is 01)
 - Do not go beyond the sub-sub-section (e.g., subsection 15.1.6.5.1.1 is 15.01.06)
- Sequential number
 - Start with 01 for each unique section number (e.g., 15.01.06-01)
 - All questions for that section will be number sequentially, even if transmitted by different letters (e.g., if a letter asks new question for section 15.1.6 and ten question have been asked previously with the section number 15.01.06, the first question in the new letter will be numbered 15.01.06-11)

Letter Numbers

Each request for additional information will be assigned a sequential number (e.g. Request for Additional Information Letter No. 033 ...)

- This letter number will be the RAI identifier (e.g., RAI-33)
- Each RAI will normally have questions for only one section

eRAIs

The NRCs master RAI database requires that an NRC RAI number be assigned. The NRC may choose to identify this number in the RAI letters to Luminant but this number will not be used in tracking questions or RAIs and will not be used as a primary reference in correspondence between the NRC and Luminant.

Other COLA Parts

The discussion above applies primarily to questions regarding the COLA FSAR. If the NRC has question regarding other parts of the COLA, a numbering system similar to that above can be used but is not defined here as numerous question in the other COLA parts are not normally asked. A potential solution is to create a number identifying the COLA part followed by a sequential number (e.g., COLA Part 05-01).
