

Individuals working with Iodine-131 in quantities greater than 1.0 millicurie per calendar quarter with chemical and physical forms that make it possible that radionuclides will be ingested, inhaled or absorbed shall be included in a bioassay program. Bioassay shall be performed within six to seventy-two hours after exposure to radioiodine.


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Condition 12 to read:


