MATERIALS LICENSE

Pursuant to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974 (Public Law 93-438), and Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter I, Parts 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 39, 40, and 70, and in reliance on statements and representations heretofore made by the licensee, a license is hereby issued authorizing the licensee to receive, acquire, possess, and transfer byproduct, source, and special nuclear material designated below; to use such material for the purpose(s) and at the place(s) designated below; to deliver or transfer such material to persons authorized to receive it in accordance with the regulations of the applicable Part(s). This license shall be deemed to contain the conditions specified in Section 183 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, and is subject to all applicable rules, regulations, and orders of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission now or hereafter in effect and to any conditions specified below.

Pursuant to Section 32.14, 10 CFR Part 32, "Specific Domestic Licenses to Manufacture or Transfer Certain Items Containing Byproduct Material"; the licensee is authorized to distribute Philips Lighting Model HPA and HPM Series lamps, and Radium Lampenwerk model lamps as described in the licensee's letter dated October 2, 2008 (all labeled as Worldwide Specialty Lamps), containing not more than 0.7 microcuries of krypton-85 to persons exempt from licensing pursuant to Section 30.15, 10 CFR Part 30, or equivalent provisions of the regulations of any Agreement State.

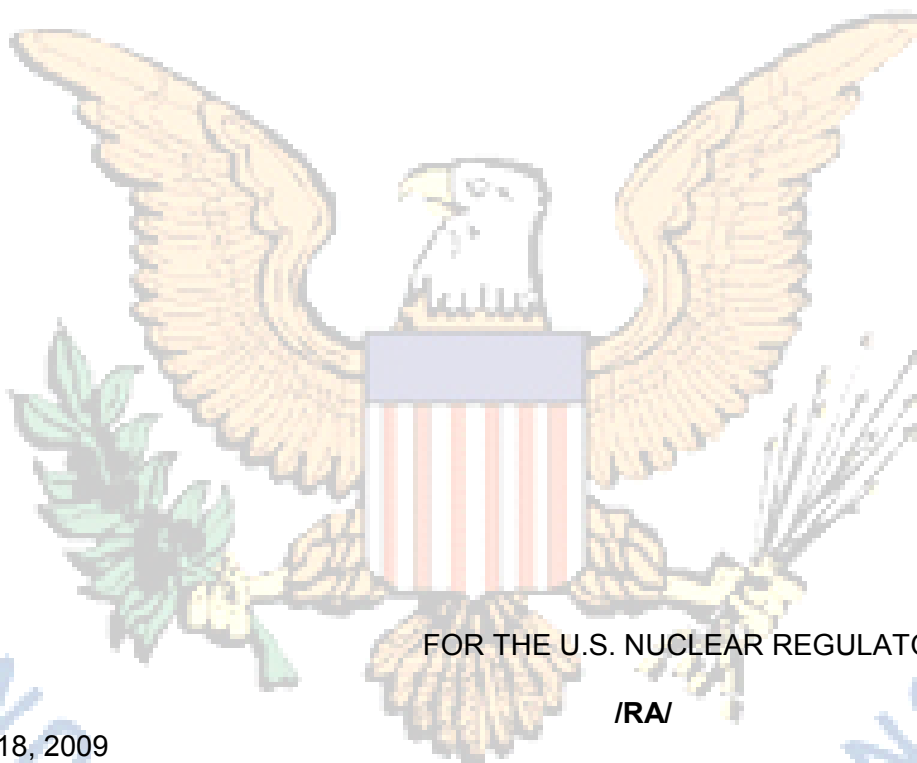
CONDITIONS

- 11. The licensee is authorized to distribute only from its facilities located at 6759 Oak Ridge Commerce Way SW, Austell, Georgia.
- 12. The licensee shall submit periodic reports as specified in Section 32.16, 10 CFR Part 32.
- 13. Notwithstanding the labeling requirements of Section 32.15(d), Part 32 as it applies to individual lamps, the licensee shall label each immediate lamp container in accordance with 10 CFR 32.15(d) and as described in the licensee's application dated May 20, 2008.
