Fitness for Duty Program Six Month Performance Report July – December 2008

PROGRAM SUMMARY:

The Grand Gulf Nuclear Station annual random testing rate is 50 percent. During this reporting period, approximately 28 percent of the population has been randomly tested. The rate of positive tests from random testing is 0 percent. The total random percentage for the year is 53 percent.

POSITIVE RESULTS:

Seven Pre-access samples confirmed positive during this reporting period. Five of the confirmations were for for illegal drugs (i.e., Cannabinoid and Amphetamine) and two of the confirmations were for alcohol. An "Other" category test sample was also confirmed positive for illegal drugs (i.e., Cocaine) during this reporting period. The specimen was a re-collection for an individual in the Follow-up Program that provided a follow-up test specimen that had a low temperature reading.

One additional pre-access sample was determined by the Medical Review Officer to be adulterated and was classified as an FFD Program violation.

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS:

Unescorted Access was not granted to the individuals that tested positive or the individual who violated the Fitness for Duty program with an adulterated specimen. In addition, the individual in the Follow-up Program who tested positive was denied Unescorted Access. In each case management was notified and the individual's files were annotated to reflect the actions taken.

Five For-cause tests were conducted during this reporting period. Four tests were on post accident and one for Observed Behavior. All tests were negative.

Fourteen individuals were in the Follow-up testing process during this reporting period.

EVENTS REPORTED TO THE NRC:

During this reporting period, there were no violations of the fitness for duty program that were reportable.

PROGRAM EVALUATION:

During this reporting period there were four minor violations that resulted from an NRC inspection. The following issues were identified:

- Donors had access to a soap dispenser in the collection area
- Failure to test a person in follow-up at the required procedural frequency
- Access not withheld for three individuals not covered under BOP for >30 days
- Personal/Confidential information stored in an unprotected network location

All issues were documented in the Entergy Corrective Action Program and resolved.
