Dear Nuclear Regulatory Commission:

I am writing to express my support for the two new proposed nuclear reactors in Fairfield County. It is my understanding that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is taking written comments on the scoping process until March 8th. I wish to go on record supporting the construction of the nuclear plants and express my strong belief that the environment will be well protected during the construction and operation of the nuclear plants.

The operators of the existing nuclear plant in Fairfield County, SCANA and Santee Cooper, have a proven record of running the VC Summer Plant in an environmentally sensitive fashion.
