Dear Nuclear Regulatory Commission:

I am writing to support the two new proposed nuclear reactors in Fairfield County. It is my understanding that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is taking written comments on the scoping process until March 8<sup>th</sup>. I wish to go on record supporting the construction of the nuclear plants and express my belief that the environment will be well protected during the construction and operation of the nuclear plants.


