Dear Mr. Raj Annad,

This email is in response to a phone message I received from you yesterday, asking to set up a telecon to discuss the comments I made at ACRS meetings about the AP1000. First, let me say thanks for letting me know that Ms. Joelle Starefos is no longer on the AP1000 project, and for attending to my inquiries in her stead. Second, let me give you some background on the recent email inquiry I sent to her.

As you may know, in the July 18th, 2003 meeting of the ACRS Subcommittee on Future Plant Designs the NRC Staff committed to writing a letter in response to the questions I asked at that meeting. To aid in that effort, and because there had been changes in NRC project management on the AP1000 project, I put together a letter clearly laying out the questions, incorporating all the previous correspondence and describing previous telecons with the NRC staff. I also included a list of all the references referred to in my questions. In addition, in a separate letter, I asked a question about heat of solar radiation and ultimate heat sink. I sent electronic pdf and hard copies of both of these letters to John Segala, Joseph Colaccino, and Joelle Starefos. The titles and dates of these letters are:
