Dear Mr. Lohmann:

On behalf of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), I am responding to your letter dated April 3, 2009. In that letter, you notified NRC about the pending transfer of ownership of Solutia Inc. to a new entity, "Newco" and you requested that export license XSOU8738 be amended to show Newco as the licensee effective April 30, 2009.

Upon review of NRC records, export license XSOU8738 was originally issued on June 22, 1995, authorizing the export of depleted uranium to various countries for use as a catalyst in the commercial process for making acrylonitrile and has had four subsequent amendments to that license, all of which expired on October 31, 2006.

In accordance with 10 CFR 110.51 (Amendment and Renewal of Licenses), an expired license is not renewable. If Newco wishes to export depleted uranium, it will need to apply for a new NRC export license. For records management associated with export license XSOU8738, please refer to 10 CFR 110.53 (United States address, Records, and Inspections) which is particularly relevant.
