## SUPPLEMENT TO PETITION TO INTERVENE BY MISSOURIANS AGAINST HIGHER UTILITY RATES

Pursuant to the requirements of the Initial Prehearing Order, filed April 27, 2009, Missourians Against Higher Utility Rates ("MAHUR") hereby supplements its petition to intervene in the application by AmerenUE ("AUE") for a combined construction and operating license ("COL") for the Callaway Unit 2 nuclear power reactor unit. To assist the Licensing Board and other participants in identifying petitioners' concerns, the Initial Prehearing Order requires that petitioners identify the part(s) of the COL application ("COLA") to which their contention(s) is directed. Initial Prehearing Order, p.2.

MAHUR's single contention is directed at <u>Part 1</u> of the COLA: <u>General, Administrative</u> and <u>Financial Information (G/A/FI)</u>. MAHUR's contention asserts that AUE does not meet the financial qualification requirements of 10 CFR § 50.33 because AUE's proposed funding of construction costs and initial core fuel supply costs rests entirely on rate-based recovery for "construction work in progress," which is currently <u>prohibited</u> by existing Missouri law (393.135 RSMo.).

In the COLA, AUE admitted that funding the project would require changing existing

State law. On April 23, 2009, AUE President and Chief Executive Officer Thomas R. Voss

acknowledged that AUE's attempt to overturn the existing law was not going to be successful

and, consequently, AUE was suspending its efforts to build the Callaway Unit 2 facility. See

Initial Prehearing Order, pp. 4-5. Thus, the deficiency identified by MAHUR in Part 1 of the

COLA now is clearly evident and publicly acknowledged by AUE.
