**DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY** 

You, Mark Alexander, have been appointed Radiation Safety Officer and are responsible for ensuring the safe use of radiation in our sealed fixed source. You are responsible for managing the Radiation Protection Program; identifying radiation protection problems; initiating, recommending, or providing corrective actions; verifying implementation of corrective actions; stopping unsafe activities; and ensuring compliance with regulations and the permit conditions, including requirement 8(A) to ensure that the maximum amount of Cesium-137 that we may possess at any one time is two sources, no single source to exceed 5,000 millicuries. You are hereby delegated the authority necessary to meet those responsibilities, including prohibiting the use of byproduct material by employees who do not meet the necessary requirements and shutting down operations where justified to maintain radiation safety. You are required to notify management if staff does not cooperate and does not address radiation safety issues. In addition, you are free to raise issues with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission at any time.
