PROPOSED IMPLEMENTATION DATES

- Section 50.54(q)
 - 30 days after final rule publication with no deferral
- Appendix E, Section IV.D.3 (Backup ANS)
 - First biennial exercise conducted more than one year after effective date of final rule
- Appendix E, Section IV.F.2 (New Exercise Req.)
 - First biennial exercise conducted more than one year after effective date of final rule
- All Other Changes
 - 30 days after final rule publication with option to defer implementation until 180 days after publication

Radiological Emergency Preparedness (REP) Program Revisions

1. REP Program Manual Updates

2. Supplement 4 to NUREG-0654/FEMA-REP-1, Rev. 1



History of Radiological Emergency Preparedness (REP) Program

- REP Program was established as a result of the 1979 accident at Three Mile Island (TMI)
 - FEMA was given responsibility for "off-site" radiological emergency preparedness to protect citizens living around commercial nuclear power plants
 - •NRC remains responsible for on-site activities and serves as the regulator for the nuclear power industry
- Under Public Law 96-295, licensing of commercial nuclear power plants requires "reasonable assurance" that off-site preparedness efforts are adequate



Key Policy Document: NUREG-0654/FEMA-REP-1, Rev. 1

- Established 16 planning standards and associated evaluation criteria – November 1980
- Provided the basis for evaluating the adequacy of offsite preparedness and findings of "reasonable assurance"
- There are three supplements to NUREG-0654/FEMA-REP-1, Rev. 1



NUREG-0654/FEMA-REP-1 Supplements

- Supplement 1 September 1988
 - Provides evaluation criteria for situations in which State and local governments decline to participate in offsite preparedness
- Supplement 2 April 1996
 - Provides guidance for the development, review, and approval of radiological emergency preparedness information and plans submitted with an early site permit application
- Supplement 3 July 1996
 - Provides guidance for the development of protective action recommendations for severe reactor accidents involving actual or projected core damage with the potential for loss of containment



NUREG-0654/FEMA-REP-1, Supplement 4:

- Provides additional guidance for development, review, and evaluation of offsite emergency response planning
 - Preparing for and responding to hostile action-based (HAB) events
 - Aligning the REP Program with national initiatives that have been adopted by State and local governments (e.g., NIMS, HSEEP)
 - Ensuring more challenging drills and exercises to enhance exercise activities
 - Ensuring backup means for Alert & Notification System
- Provides the basis for changes to REP Program Manual



Purpose of the REP Program Manual

- Provides FEMA policy and interpretation of regulations and guidance in:
 - 44 CFR 350
 - NUREG 0654/FEMA-REP-1, Rev. 1
- Provides a consolidated source of policy and guidance for REP employees, licensees, State, local, and tribal preparedness personnel (i.e., a Desk Reference)
- Aligns FEMA offsite activities under 44 CFR 350 with NRC regulations in 10 CFR part 50 and NRC's proposed rulemaking activities



Key Drivers of REP Program Manual Revisions

- State and local requests to align REP policy/guidance with tenets of National Incident Management System (NIMS), National Response Framework (NRF), Integrated Planning System (IPS), National Exercise Program (NEP) and the Homeland Security Exercise Evaluation Program (HSEEP)
- Enhance scenario realism and eliminate pre-conditioned exercise activities (negative learning)
- Establish "Part II," embedding planning guidance that was not included in 2002 Interim version
- Incorporate and retire FEMA REP's legacy operative policy and program memoranda



Key Areas of Policy Change in REP Program Manual and Supplement 4

- Preparing for and responding to hostile action-based (HAB) events
- Aligning the REP Program with national initiatives (e.g., NIMS/ICS and HSEEP)
- Ensuring more challenging drills and exercises to enhance exercise activities
- Ensuring backup means for Alert & Notification System



Enhancing Exercise Activities

- The FEMA/NRC Exercise Scenario Task Force was established in late 2007 to address "scenario realism" in REP exercises.
- The Task Force focused on 3 areas for improvement:
 - Reduce response organizations' exercise "pre-conditioning"
 - Vary amount and type of simulated radioactive releases during exercise play
 - Enhance response to hostile action-based (HAB) events
- Subsequent effort focused on integration of REP methodologies and HSEEP doctrine



Preparing for HAB Incidents

- Coordination between OROs and licensees
- KI and dosimetry for ORO resources augmenting NPP requirements
- Access to the NPP site
- Protective action decisions (evacuation & sheltering in place)
- Public information considerations



Key Changes to NUREG-0654/FEMA REP-1

New Evaluation Criterion:

C.6. Each organization shall make provisions to enable onsite response support from OROs in a hostile action-based incident as needed.

NOTE: Evaluation criterion C.5 was added by Supplement 1 to NUREG 0654/FEMA REP 1, Rev. 1.



Key Changes to NUREG-0654/FEMA REP-1

- NUREG Criterion N.1.b changes include:
 - Evaluating offsite performance in accordance with HSEEP guidance
 - Incorporating the following scenario variations:
 - Hostile action events;
 - Varied simulated radiological releases;
 - Rapid escalation to a site area emergency or general emergency; and,
 - Integration of offsite resources with onsite response.



Consistency with National Initiatives

- HSPD-5 and HSPD-8 establish initiatives for a national, common approach to preparedness
- Key elements of the National Preparedness System include:
 - National Incident Management System (NIMS) and National Response Framework (NRF)
 - Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP)
 - Integrated Planning System (IPS)



Key Changes to NUREG-0654/FEMA REP-1

Aligning REP with national initiatives:

• NUREG Criterion A.1.a is revised to add: ORO plans shall be compliant with the National Incident Management System (NIMS).



Key Changes to NUREG-0654/FEMA REP-1

Aligning REP with national initiatives:

• NUREG Criterion N.1.a. is revised to add: Exercises shall be conducted as set forth in NRC and FEMA rules and in accordance with the standardized methodology of the Homeland Security Exercise Evaluation Program (HSEEP).



Backup Means for Alert & Notification

Supplement 4 revises NUREG-0654/FEMA-REP-1, Rev. 1, Appendix 3, Section B.2 to add a requirement to provide a backup means for the alert and notification system
