SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY REVIEW OF
A COMBINED LICENSE APPLICATION FROM FLORIDA POWER AND LIGHT
FOR TWO NEW REACTOR UNITS AT THE TURKEY POINT SITE

Dear Ms. Quinn:

On June 30, 2009, Florida Power and Light (applicant) submitted a combined license (COL) application to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) for two new reactor units in Dade County, Florida. We are providing the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) with one copy (DVD) of the application for use in reviewing the offsite emergency planning information, as part of the NRC's review and proposed issuance of a COL, pursuant to Subpart C of 10 CFR Part 52. Per our arrangement with you, we are providing two copies (DVDs) of the same application to Conrad Burnside in FEMA Region IV.

Please note that the NRC is conducting a review of the entire application for sensitive information. Until further notice, the information contained in the application, including offsite emergency planning information and any proprietary information, must remain non-publicly available.

We request that FEMA perform an acceptance review of the application materials, particularly focusing on the offsite emergency planning (EP) information. FEMA should provide the NRC, by July 29, 2009, a statement as to the completeness and technical adequacy of the application for docketing, as requested by letter sent to FEMA from the NRC on June 2, 2009. The acceptance review should establish that submitted offsite emergency planning information is sufficiently complete in content and depth such that a detailed review can be performed subject to possible requests for additional information (RAIs), in support of preparing the required safety evaluation report. If the application materials are not complete and/or technically sufficient, then an explanation of what is missing or needed to resolve the concerns should be provided to the NRC.

A four phase schedule for the Turkey Point COL application is being developed. The schedule will include tasks for all phases of the safety review. The NRC staff will send you the schedule once it has been finalized and approved. Per our prior arrangement with you, we will also provide a copy of this schedule to Conrad Burnside in FEMA Region IV.
