Re: Demand for Information and Reporting Damaged Devices
Containing Radioactive Material

Dear Ms. McIntosh,

General Motors is requesting an extension of time in which to respond to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Demand for Information dated May 29, 2009, and received on June 1, 2009.

On June 1, 2009, General Motors filed for bankruptcy under Chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy code. On July 5, 2009, the US Bankruptcy Court granted General Motors' motion under §363 of the bankruptcy code to sell a majority of its assets to NGMCO, Inc. an entity funded by the US Department of Treasury. On July 10, 2009 the sale was complete and the new company name is General Motors Company. The remaining assets will stay with the debtor, Motors Liquidation Corporation (formerly known as old General Motors Corporation) and likely be liquidated.

The pending bankruptcy proceedings and the current economic conditions have forced General Motors to idle a number of facilities and temporarily lay off employees. This period also coincides with the annual GM shutdown the first two weeks in July when GM facilities are retooled and general maintenance is performed. In the interim, we have been working diligently gathering the information you requested. However, given the scope of the information request, the number of facilities involved, the bankruptcy proceedings and the new ownership status of GM's existing facilities, General Motors requires additional time to compile the information requested. At this time, we are asking for an additional 90 days to complete the work. This would make our response due on October 31, 2009.
