Dr. Oaks:

Enercon Services, Inc. is preparing an environmental report for application on behalf of the TXU Generation Company LP to be submitted to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission. The application is for a combined continuation and operating license to build two additional reactors at the existing Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station in Somervell County, Texas. The environmental report will include compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as amended, provisions of 36CFR800, and applicable requirements by the State of Texas. A map of the project area is attached.

The existing facility is located adjacent to Squaw Creek Reservoir approximately six miles north of the town of Glen Rose. Archeological investigations of the area were conducted by Southern Methodist University between 1972 and 1974, prior to construction of the existing facilities. Twenty-seven Aboriginal and European-American locations were investigated, but did not record any such localities on the actual power plant facility. There are no older standing structures or previously recorded cultural properties within the Area of Potential Effect. We request your opinion whether a new archeological survey would be needed; if so, we will engage one of the contracting firms listed on the Council of Texas Archeologists website.

We would appreciate your review and comments on the proposed project and look forward to your response.
