B. The Radiation Protection Officer for the activities authorized by this license is Kimm K. Karrip.
12. Pursuant to Section 32.11, 10 CFR Part 32, the licensee is authorized to transfer engines containing tritium as a contaminant in residual engine oil at a concentration not to exceed 3×10^{-2} microcuries per milliliter as a product containing an exempt concentration of byproduct material. The concentration shall be controlled in accordance with procedures described in facsimile dated March 19, 2001. Transfers shall be reported in accordance with Section 32.12, 10 CFR Part 32.
13. Licensed material shall not be used in or on human beings or in field applications where activity is released except as provided otherwise by specific condition of this license.
