Dear Mr. Monarque,

I represent 150,000 people in Fort Worth, my district falls with-in the 50-mile radius of the proposed Comanche Peak 3 & 4 reactors. The city of Fort Worth as a whole, with a population of 702,850, also falls completely within the 50 mile radius.

I have serious concerns about the environmental scoping meetings held on the afternoon and evening of January 6th in Glen Rose. The twelve day notice for the meeting that was sent occurred during the height of the winter holiday season, a time when many people are out of town, on vacation, or involved with family get-togethers.

Many who received the notice did not return to work and check their e-mail until January 5, the day before the meeting. In addition, those who had been told by the NRC that they were on an official e-mail list and would be notified of any meeting scheduled were not contacted.

Please honor the spirit of the reporting requirements by immediately scheduling a meeting at an easily accessible location in Fort Worth, where the largest population in the 50 mile radius of the plant resides. Other communities have had more than one NRC scoping meeting. Given the less than transparent nature of the last meeting's schedule it is only fair.
