INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT BETWEEN
Electronic Research Administration
Office of Extramural Research
Office of the Director
NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH
AND
NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION

This agreement sets forth the terms under which the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) (hereinafter Collaborating Agency) is transferring funds to the National Institutes of Health (NIH), for use of the I-Edison system.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this inter-agency agreement is to transfer \$40,000 from Collaborating Agency to NIH for the support and use of I-Edison.

AUTHORITIES

This agreement is entered into under the authority of Section 301 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 241) and the Clinger-Cohen Act of 1996 (40 U.S.C. 1401, et seq).

BACKGROUND

The Bayh-Dole Act gives contractors/grantees a right to elect title to Federally-supported subject inventions as a means to better promote commercialization of these inventions and bring these inventions to practical application, subject to a government license to use or license others to use the invention for Government purposes under the Act. Contractors/grantees must meet certain reporting milestones to ensure that inventions made with Federal support are brought to practical application and appropriately commercialized. Since NIH and the Collaborating Agency must ensure compliance with the same federal reporting requirements, tracking of government rights and compliance with Federal regulations for both parties by the NIH through a single system would improve efficiencies.

A major thrust of the reinventing government initiative has been to streamline reporting procedures through the use of electronic transmission of information and the development of standard formats and reporting procedures across government agencies. Contractors and grantees have also identified these goals as a high priority. To this end, the NIH developed and established Interagency Edison (iEdison) (see <http://iEdison.gov>), an electronic invention reporting and tracking system to assist the agency and contractors/grantees in timelier reporting of inventions arising from Federal support. Reporting through iEdison simply and effectively allows contractors/grantees to comply with the law and applicable supplemental regulations and improves the tracking of government rights. The administration of invention information in the established iEdison system for agencies improves the efficiency of Government operations.

NIH maintains and enhances the iEdison system for the U.S. Government based on Federal and user requirements.






