

[Introduction to the NRC]

- Who we are:
 - The Energy Reorganization Act of 1974 established the independent U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission to regulate commercial uses of nuclear material.
 - NRC is headed by four Commissioners and a Chairman, all appointed by the President and confirmed by the Senate for staggered five-year terms.
 - NRC employs about 3,700 people in its suburban Maryland headquarters and four regional offices in Pennsylvania, Georgia, Illinois, and Texas.
 - NRC has assigned resident inspectors to 65 nuclear power plant sites and three fuel facilities.

[Primary NRC Functions]


- Establish rules and regulations
- Provide oversight through inspection, enforcement, and evaluation of operational experience
- Conduct research to provide support for regulatory decisions
- Issue licenses
- Respond to emergencies



[Emergency Responsibilities]

- Licensee:
 - Mitigate the accident and its consequences
 - Properly classify and notify off-site officials of the event
 - Prepare and communicate Protective Action Recommendations (PARs) to State and local officials



[NRC Event Responsibilities]


- Activate the agency's response centers
- Assess plant conditions
- Evaluate protective action recommendations
- Support off-site officials
- Keep other agencies informed
- Keep news media informed



[NRC Response Modes]

Based upon NRC's independent assessment:

- Normal Mode
- Monitoring Mode
- Activation Mode
- Expanded Activation Mode



[24/7 Operations Officers]



- Headquarters Operations Officers (HOO) and Emergency Response Officers (HERO) staff the NRC Operations Center 24/7. They receive and assess all incoming information, coordinate event-related communications, and facilitate a fast startup of the NRC incident response organization if conditions warrant.





[NRC Site Team]

- 10-15 specialists dispatched from regional office.
- Interface directly with licensee, media, and State/ local officials.
- Conduct technical assessment of licensee response.

[Security-Based Event Response]

- Physical Attack
 - Prompt notification from licensee
 - Authentication code verified
 - Key details provided by licensee
- Aircraft Threat
 - Notification from Department of Defense
 - Inform licensees within 100-mile radius
 - Authentication code verified

- HQ's and all Regions' Information Assessment Teams

- Reactor and Fuel Cycle Facilities (Blast dial) – request increase security posture

[Aircraft Threat Response]

■ HERO:

- Monitors Defense Red Switch telephone with Department of Defense
- Passes track-of-interest (TOI) information to Headquarters Operations Officer

■ HOO:

- Establishes a conference call with licensee control rooms (100-mile radius) and the first Imminent Security Threat Authority manager

■ Imminent Security Threat Authority:

- Ensures licensees carry out Imminent Aircraft Attack procedures and, if necessary, issues Orders

[Security Enhancements]

- Added security officers, patrols, and checkpoints
- Increased surveillance of owner-controlled and protected areas
- Modified DBT to reflect current threat
- Upgraded security officer training and qualification programs
- Increased access authorization control
- Enhanced barriers



[Security Enhancements]

- Intensified search procedures
- Re-assessed access authorization lists
- Increased awareness of suspicious activities near the plants
- Increased interaction with NRC on security
- Improved liaison with local agencies
- Enhanced coordination with Federal agencies



[Force-on-Force Program]

- Performance-based testing of site security:
 - Part of baseline inspection program
- Three-year cycle legislated by the Energy Policy Act of 2005
- Enhanced exercise realism post-9/11:
 - MILES (Laser Targeted System)
 - Composite Adversary Force
