Dear Ms. McIntosh:

This letter is being submitted on behalf of United Airlines ("United") to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC") as a supplement to United's June 15 and July 15, 2009 letters in response to the above-referenced Demand for Information regarding tritium-containing building exit signs ("tritium building signs"). Consistent with the June 15 and July 15 letters, United has been engaged in the process of implementing a formal compliance plan for tritium building signs. With this letter, United is providing the NRC with final updates on the compliance plan and confirming that implementation of United's compliance plan is complete.

One important update involves changes in United's tritium building signs inventory. United conducted removal of all tritium building signs at its operations at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX). During the process of removing these signs, 18 signs were identified, 3 more than the 15 signs previously identified at this location. Removal and transfer of the tritium building signs was managed in accordance with applicable regulatory requirements. After removal of the 18 signs at LAX, United's inventory of tritium building signs has been reduced from 34 tritium building signs at 4 locations to 16 tritium building signs at 3 locations.

Also, because all tritium building signs have been removed at LAX, the United contact for LAX, Mike Hanna, should be removed from the list of persons responsible for day-to-day compliance with NRC requirements for tritium building signs. Accordingly, with Mr. Hanna removed from the list, the following 3 contacts are the persons responsible for day-to-day compliance:

Finally, United has also completed roll-out of a program coordinated by the corporate Real Estate department to address addition of tritium building signs to United's inventory through new leases or acquisition of new buildings. United's corporate Real Estate department has established procedures, in coordination with other departments, for inspecting and obtaining information on tritium building signs at new locations so that on a going-forward basis the inventory can be updated as needed and local personnel incorporated into the compliance program and notified of the NRC requirements. Development of these procedures for new locations is now complete, and the procedures will be implemented for new locations as needed in the future.

With the establishment of procedures to address tritium building sign management in new locations, United's implementation of its formal compliance program for tritium building signs is now complete. United is committed to managing its inventory of tritium signs under this compliance program and in accordance with applicable regulatory requirements. United believes that this letter and the previous letters sent by United on June 15, 2009 and July 15, 2009 complete United's response to the NRC and resolve its obligations with respect to the NRC's inquiry regarding United's tritium building signs.
