### ORDER

The Board has been informed by the NRC Staff in its latest status report that, on September 30, 2009, the State of New Jersey and the NRC reached an agreement, pursuant to Section 274 of the Atomic Energy Act, whereby New Jersey assumed regulatory authority over source materials under 10 C.F.R. Part 40.1 This authority extends to Shieldalloy's Newfield facility and, accordingly, the NRC has terminated its technical review of Shieldalloy's decommissioning plan.<sup>2</sup>

Additionally, Shieldalloy has informed the Board that it has filed two suits against New Jersey.<sup>3</sup> One suit, filed in the United States District Court for the District of New Jersey, seeks, among other relief, to enjoin application of New Jersey's regulatory requirements to the Newfield

facility.<sup>4</sup> The other suit, filed in the Appellate Division of the New Jersey Superior Court, challenges the validity of those regulations.<sup>5</sup> Shieldalloy also intends to seek judicial review of the NRC's decision to transfer regulatory authority over source materials to New Jersey and has moved before the Commission for a stay of that transfer pendente lite.<sup>6</sup>

Given that the NRC Staff is no longer conducting a technical review of Shieldalloy's decommissioning plan, the Board hereby <u>suspends</u> the obligation to file bi-monthly status reports, the sole purpose of which was to keep the Board informed as to the progress of that review. Nevertheless, the Staff remains obligated to inform the Board promptly of any significant developments relevant to this proceeding. Of course, restoration of the bi-monthly reports might be directed at a later date should the technical review be resumed.
