Enclosed is Amendment No. 58 to your NRC Material License No. 21-13125-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in bold font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

In my letter to you transmitting Amendment No. 57, I stated that I had added several documents to your final, "tie-down" condition, which then appeared as No. 26, which referenced your responses and commitments pertaining to the Increased Controls and Fingerprinting Orders.

This was a misunderstanding and error on my part and I have deleted these documents from your "tie-down" condition, now shown as No. 23, at this time. I apologize for any inconvenience this error may have caused you.

In this amendment I deleted a number of Authorized Users, in accordance with your request in the letter dated August 3, 2009, and I deleted authorization for intravascular brachytherapy (IVBT) in Subitem Nos. 6. through 9.G., inclusive. Several other conditions were deleted as well because they related to the IVBT authorization and were no longer needed.
