SUBJECT: CLINTON POWER STATION, UNIT NO. 1 - REQUEST FOR WITHHOLDING
INFORMATION FROM PUBLIC DISCLOSURE (TAC NO. ME1643)

Dear Mr. Pardee:

By letter to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) dated June 26, 2009 (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Package No. ML091801065), Exelon Generation Company, LLC (EGC) submitted an affidavit dated June 23, 2009, executed by James F. Harrison, Vice President, Fuel Licensing, Regulatory Affairs, GE-Hitachi Nuclear Energy Americas LLC. (GEH), requesting that information designated proprietary in the following document be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to paragraph (a)(4) of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR), Part 2, Section 2.390:

- NEDC-33505P, Revision 0, Class III, DRF 0000-0100-5453, June 2009, "Safety Analysis Report to Support GE14i Introduction of Isotope Test Assemblies (ITAs) in Clinton Power Station"

The proprietary version of the document and the GEH affidavit are in Attachment 3 to the letter dated June 26, 2009, from EGC to the NRC, for the Clinton Power Station, Unit No. 1.

A non-proprietary copy of the document, provided as Attachment 4 to the letter dated June 26, 2009, has been added to the ADAMS Public Electronic Reading Room (ADAMS Accession No. ML091801061).

The affidavit stated that the submitted information should be considered exempt from mandatory public disclosure for the following reasons:

- (a) Information that discloses a process, method, or apparatus, including supporting data and analyses, where prevention of its use by GEH's competitors without license from GEH constitutes a competitive economic advantage over other companies;
- (b) Information which, if used by a competitor, would reduce his expenditure of resources or improve his competitive position in the design, manufacture, shipment, installation, assurance of quality, or licensing of a similar product;

We have reviewed your submittal in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 2.390 and, on the basis of the statements in the affidavit, have determined that the information sought to be withheld contains proprietary commercial information and should be withheld from public disclosure.

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Therefore, the version of the submitted information marked as proprietary will be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.390(b)(5) and Section 103(b) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.

Withholding from public inspection shall not affect the right, if any, of persons properly and directly concerned to inspect the documents. If the need arises, we may send copies of this information to our consultants working in this area. We will, of course ensure that the consultants have signed the appropriate agreements for handling proprietary information.

If the basis for withholding this information from public inspection should change in the future such that the information could then be made available for public inspection, you should promptly notify the NRC. You should also understand that the NRC may have cause to review this determination in the future, for example, if the scope of a Freedom of Information Act request includes your information. In all review situations, if the NRC makes a determination adverse to the above, you will be notified in advance of any public disclosure.
