Transportation

With its proximity and access to the Chesapeake Bay, the Atlantic Ocean, Washington distribution routes, Maryland plays a vital role in transportation throughout the Eastern United States.

Consider a few of Maryland's transportation infrastructure highlights:

- Overnight trucking access to one-third of the U.S. population - 100 million people
- A deep-water, inland port that handles more than 40 million tons of cargo annually
- Two Class I railroads - CSX and Norfolk Southern - and five short lines
- Six interstate highways that link the State to every major U.S. market
- Three international airports within an hour's drive - with BWI Thurgood Marshall International Airport handling over 10 million pounds of air cargo every year
