- 1. Convention.** Mr. Aaron McCraw convened the meeting at 2:03 p.m. He noted that this MRB meeting was open to the public; however, no members of the public participated in this meeting. He then transferred the lead to Mr. Marty Virgilio, Chair of the MRB. Introductions of the attendees were conducted.
- 2. Discussion.** Ms. Linda McLean led the discussion of the status of the Arizona Agreement State Program and the potential effects on the program from the State's lack of a budget for Arizona's Fiscal Year 2010. Ms. McLean explained that the program may be forced to begin laying off staff as a result of limited funding for the remainder of the Fiscal Year. Mr. Aubrey Godwin informed the MRB that the Arizona Legislature was planning to meet in a special session in the coming weeks. During the special session, the Arizona Radiation Regulatory Agency (the Agency), which administers the Agreement State program, could be awarded sufficient funds to allow the program to operate through the end of Arizona's fiscal year, which ends on June 30, 2010. Mr. Virgilio asked Mr. Godwin how the layoffs would affect the Agreement State program and what plan does the Agency have to ensure that public health and safety will continue to be adequately protected after the layoffs. Mr. Godwin responded that the Agency would maintain a skeleton crew but would be able to keep the licensing and inspection programs going. Mr. Godwin informed the MRB that the State does not have any plans to give the Agreement back. Mr. Steve Reynolds expressed concern that the Agency still needs to address the weaknesses identified during the 2008 IMPEP review and that the layoffs would impede any further progress on addressing the weaknesses. Mr. Godwin explained that there are ways that the Agency could gain efficiencies in the Agreement

State program, such as adopting NRC's inspection frequencies and/or moving to a 10-year license renewal. The MRB collectively expressed the need for assurance that the program can continue to adequately protect public health and safety. Mr. Virgilio suggested, and the MRB unanimously agreed, that NRC send a letter of support to the Arizona Governor to remind the Governor of the State's responsibilities under the Agreement with NRC and to request adequate resources for the program. Mr. Virgilio encouraged the program to seek assistance from other Agreement States

3. **Adjournment.** The meeting was adjourned at approximately 3:00 p.m.
