PHONE CONVERSATION WITH REGION II EPA OFFICE ON CONSOLIDATED EDISON COMPANY - FWPCA - SECTION 402 PERMIT FOR INDIAN POINT UNITS NOS. 1 AND 2

On July 1, 1974, I talked with Harvey Lumenfeld, Chief, Energy and Thermal Source Water Section, Regional Office II of Environmental Protection Agency, regarding the issuance of the Section 402 permits under the FWPCAA of 1972 for Consolidated Edison Company's Indian Point Units Nos. 1 and 2. On June 28, 1974, a public notice with the 402 permits for Units Nos: 1 and 2 was issued to Con Ed requiring cooling towers by July 1, 1978. Copies of the permits will be sent to me within the next few days.

Lumenfeld stated that statutory requirements resulted in selection of cooling towers by 1978 based on EPA's "best technical judgement on a national level." The chances for the water quality guidelines changing appear to be pretty slim. He could not understand why the Appeal Board changed the date for cooling towers for Unit No. 2 until May 1979. I will arrange to send a copy of ALAB-188 to him. Con Ed will have 30 days to file for a Section 316 (a) waiver.

At the F.A.B. meeting, on June 19, 1974, N. Sachs, Con Ed attorney, said Con Ed will take EPA up to the Supreme Court to fight the requirement for cooling towers for steam generating plants.

Con Ed has not applied for a Section 402 permit for Unit No. 3. EPA also requested a meeting be held to discuss the IP case and the requirements and timing for cooling towers.
