Dear Sir:

Section 3.2 of the Indian Point 3 Non-Radiological Environmental Protection Plan requires that violations of the SPDES Permit be reported to the NRC by the submittal of a copy of the reports required by the SPDES Permit. The NRC Staff has interpreted this provision as requiring notification of excursions from the SPDES Permit effluent limits, regardless of whether or not the excursion resulted in a Notice of Violation issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). Accordingly, Attachment I provides a copy of the cover letters which transmitted the monthly Indian Point Station Discharge Monitoring Reports for the period from July 1989 to December 1989 to the DEC. Each cover letter is accompanied by a summary page listing the month's excursions from the SPDES Permit effluent limits. To date, violations have not been cited by the DEC.
