Applicant filed its Application on December 6, 1965. In the intervening period Applicant has heretofore filed two amendments to its Application. Further additional data have now been requested by the regulatory staff of the Commission which is supplied herewith. Specifically, this Amendment No. 3 transmits:

1. Further technical information orally requested by the Staff on June 3, 1966 and relating to Applicant's containment structure. The requested information is supplied herewith as Exhibit B-3 entitled, "Third Supplement to Preliminary Safety Analysis Report."

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2. Certain financial and managerial information requested in a letter dated February 9, 1966. The information requested in the second, third and fourth paragraphs of that letter is contained in Exhibit A-1 attached hereto and relates to estimated cost of construction of the plant, the 1965 Annual Report and a schedule of estimated requirements of special nuclear material. In the third paragraph of the aforesaid letter the Staff requested Applicant to state its expected method for financing the cost of construction of this facility. Applicant expects to finance the construction of its Indian Point No. 2 facility in the ordinary course of business. In answer to the inquiry raised in the fifth paragraph of the February 9, 1966 letter, Applicant states that it will protect itself financially against the loss or damage of special nuclear material in its possession or under its control for which it will be financially responsible to the Commission by purchasing the appropriate and available nuclear property insurance.

WHEREFORE, Applicant prays as in its original Application for Licenses.






