REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc.
("Consolidated Edison") requests the Atomic Energy Commission to grant an exemption to Consolidated Edison from any limiting operating requirements set forth in proposed technical specifications or license amendments which may be submitted for Indian Point 2 pursuant to Section 50.46(a)(2) of the regulations of the Atomic Energy Commission. Consolidated Edison requests such exemption to be granted until September 30, 1974. The accompanying affidavits of William J. Cahill, Jr. and Stephen B. Bram demonstrate that good cause exists for the exemption requested herein and, furthermore, that such exemption would be in the public interest.

Pursuant to Section 50.46(a)(2)(ii) of the regulations of the Atomic Energy Commission, Consolidated Edison is required to submit an evaluation of emergency

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core cooling system ("ECCS") performance together with proposed technical specification changes or license amendments to the Director of Regulation by August 4, 1974. The required evaluation has not yet been completed and, therefore, Consolidated Edison is not certain whether technical specification changes or license amendments limiting the operation of Indian Point 2 will be proposed.

Consolidated Edison, however, has submitted today a request for an extension of the time in which to file its ECCS evaluation for Indian Point 2. Although Consolidated Edison has taken such action and although a proposed power reduction resulting from the completed evaluation is a mere possibility, Consolidated Edison considers this request for an exemption to be a prudent action in the public interest.


3. It is my understanding that the regulations of the Atomic Energy Commission require Consolidated Edison to submit an evaluation of emergency core cooling system performance for Indian Point 2 together with proposed technical

specification changes or license amendments. Whether the proposed technical specification changes or license amendments will, in fact, set forth limiting operating requirements in order to bring operation of the Indian Point 2 reactor into conformity with Section 50.46(a)(1) of the Commission's regulations cannot be determined until the evaluation referenced above is completed.
