

Dear Mr. Lear

In response to your letter of December 18, 1974, we are presently re-investigating the possible failure of non-Category I equipment which could adversely affect the performance of safety-related equipment required for safe shutdown of the facility or to limit the consequences of a potential accident.

In response to a September 26, 1972 letter from the Regulatory Staff (Mr. DeYoung to Mr. William J. Cahill, Jr.), a similar analysis was performed. Our letter of December 18, 1972, outlined the protective measures which we proposed to take. These measures included installing redundant level alarms in the common Turbine Hall for Indian Point Units 1 and 2, and modifying a number of doors in the plant to assure that adequate drainage of the enclosed rooms could be achieved. These modifications have since been implemented, and no further actions are presently believed to be necessary.

We are reviewing the previous analysis in light of your December 18, 1974 letter and as you have requested, we will submit the results within sixty days following the date of your letter.
