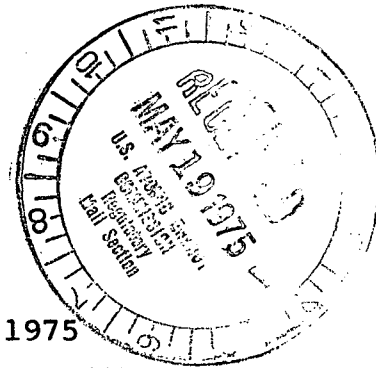

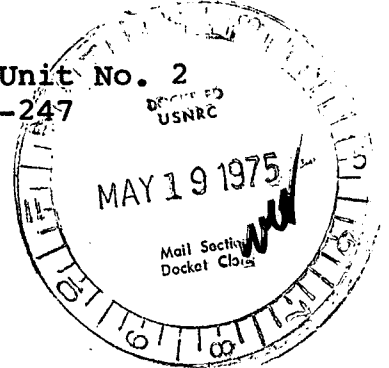

Dear Mr. Lear:

We are in receipt of your letter of May 7, 1975 stating the Staff's conclusion that to be within the criteria of 10CFR50.46 (b) (1) and the Interim Acceptance Criteria for the Emergency Core Cooling System, the water levels in the Indian Point Unit No. 2 accumulators should be in agreement with those specified in our proposed Technical Specifications submitted on September 6, 1974.

Accordingly, on May 14, 1975 the liquid volumes in the four accumulators at Indian Point Unit No. 2 were increased to be within the range 734 cubic feet to 749 cubic feet as specified in your letter.
