


Dear Mr. Lear:

This is in response to your letter of December 27, 1974. Westinghouse Electric Corporation is performing the re-analysis of our Emergency Core Cooling System (ECCS) performance. From our discussions with Westinghouse based on their discussions of the status of their revised evaluation model with the Regulatory Staff, the re-evaluation is expected to be completed by March 1975. In order to establish a firm schedule for our acceptance and submittal of the analysis to the NRC, we will first need to review it to determine the extent of possible changes to our Technical Specifications necessary to fulfill your requirements. However, we will in any case meet your required submittal date of July 9, 1975, and should the analysis and our proposed amendments to our license be completed before that date, they will be submitted promptly.
