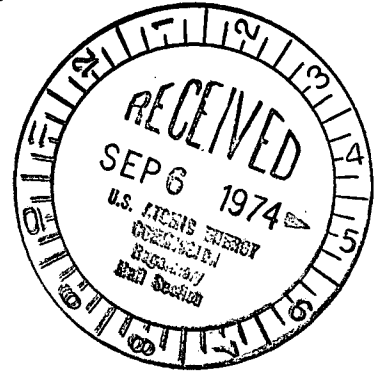

REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. ("Consolidated Edison") requests the Atomic Energy Commission to grant an exemption to Consolidated Edison from the limiting operating requirements set forth in the proposed technical specifications for Indian Point 2 which are being submitted today pursuant to Section 50.46(a)(2) of the regulations of the Atomic Energy Commission. The proposed technical specifications are set forth in Attachment A to Consolidated Edison's Application for Amendment to Technical Specifications sworn to on September 5, 1974.

Consolidated Edison requests such exemption to be granted for forty-five (45) days until October 21, 1974. Such exemption will permit sufficient time for the retraining


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of all licensed operators so that proper implementation of the technical specification changes will be assured. The accompanying affidavit of William J. Cahill, Jr., together with the affidavit of Stephen B. Bram sworn to on June 19, 1974 and attached to Consolidated Edison's Request for Exemption dated June 20, 1974, demonstrate that good cause exists for the exemption requested herein and, furthermore, that such exemption would be in the public interest.
