REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME IN
WHICH TO FILE ECCS EVALUATION

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc.
("Consolidated Edison"), as holder of Facility Operating
License No. DPR-26, hereby requests the Director of
Regulation to extend the period in which Consolidated
Edison is to submit an evaluation of emergency core
cooling system ("ECCS") performance for Indian Point 2.
As required by Section 50.46(a)(2)(ii) of the regulations
of the Atomic Energy Commission ("the Commission"),
Consolidated Edison is to submit an ECCS evaluation
together with proposed changes in technical specifications
or license amendments by August 4, 1974. As stated herein

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and more fully in the accompanying affidavits of William J. Cahill, Jr. and Robert A. Wieseemann, good cause exists to support this request for an extension for such submittal.

The evaluation required by Section 50.46(a)(1) of the regulations of the Atomic Energy Commission is being prepared by Westinghouse Electric Corporation ("Westinghouse"), the nuclear steam system supplier for Indian Point 2 and is expected to be completed by July 18, 1974. Westinghouse cannot provide the Indian Point 2 evaluation at an earlier date because Westinghouse is simultaneously preparing the required evaluations of ECCS performance for numerous other facilities.

Commencing on receipt of Westinghouse's evaluation, Consolidated Edison will review such evaluation and will prepare appropriate proposed changes in technical specifications or license amendments on an accelerated schedule. Assuming receipt of Westinghouse's material by July 18, 1974, Consolidated Edison will complete and submit the required evaluation for Indian Point 2 by August 30, 1974.

WHEREFORE, Consolidated Edison respectfully requests that the period in which to submit the evaluation required

by Section 50.46(a)(2)(ii) be extended until August 30,
1974.
