As Secretary of the Committee To End Radiological Hazards, I wish to appear for the Committee at the Public Hearing to be held at Buchanan, New York on August 31st on the proposed Second Nuclear Unit at the Indian Point nuclear power plant.

Since the proposed new unit of 873 megawatts would enlarge the Indian Point plant to four times its present nuclear power, the radius of its effects will now directly involve the metropolitan area of New York City; and our Committee has therefore a direct concern in the question of its construction.

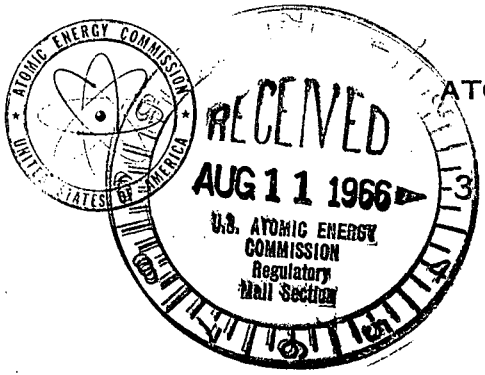

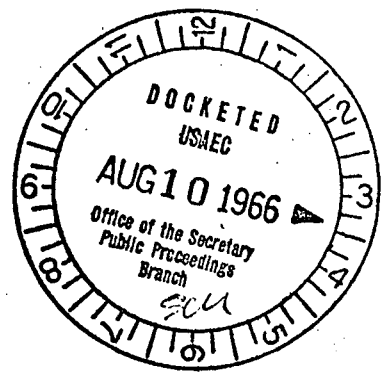

Dear Miss Weik:

Further receipt is acknowledged of your letter of August 4, 1966, respecting appearance at the hearing of the application of Consolidated Edison Company for a construction permit. As a part of general policy considerations for all cases, the Commission has announced that an explanation should be given of the two methods for appearing in a case. The Office of the Secretary of the Commission has sent to you a copy of the Rules of Practice which describe more fully these two methods for making an appearance, which briefly are, either as a party intervenor, which is a party with an interest that may be affected by the decision in the proceeding, and with the right to ask questions of the witnesses, also introduce evidence if desired, or secondly, as a limited participant who is entitled to present an oral or written statement.


The August 17 hearing is designated a prehearing conference for initial consideration of the issues specified for consideration by the Commission, and a general discussion of the nature of the evidence by the applicant and the staff, and any of the intervenors, and methods for submittal thereof, related to the issues in the case. The prehearing conference is open to the public but appearances by limited participants may be more fully considered at the evidentiary hearing now scheduled for August 31, 1966. Any changes in these arrangements will be made by public notice at the prehearing conference or by formal order given general public distribution, all in accordance with the Commission's Rules of Practice.

After your review of the Rules of Practice, you may desire to give further consideration to the scope of your appearance, information concerning which should be given in accordance with the Rules, to all parties in the proceeding. The parties of record at the time you file your request to appear are entitled to answer or comment on your request, and consideration of these matters, if a formal petition to appear is not filed, may be undertaken when the evidentiary portion of the proceeding convenes.
