Please consider this letter as a formal petition under oath as you suggested in your letter of December 3, 1970 regarded the public hearing on December 17.

My interest is whether there is reasonable assurance that the proposed concentration of nuclear plants at Indian Point will not endanger the health and safety of the public.

Will a high concentration of these plants multiply the hazards of radiation?

Dr. John W. Gofman of A.E.C.'s Lawrence Radiation Laboratory is concerned over the radiation dosage the A.E.C. permits in the atmosphere which could cause cancer and leukemia deaths each year.

Dr. E. J. Sternglas has warned of normal discharges and accidental releases from nuclear power plants that could cause an increase in the infant mortality rate.

Is one small section of residential Westchester to have a concentration of nuclear power plants that can endanger all living matter for fifty miles?
